I too have enjoyed bringing greetings from Wa Wa Shrine and speaking on our philanthropy to the Daughters of the Nile and Job's Daughters at both of their annual Instillations. I will also be bringing Shrine greetings to the Order of the Eastern Star, Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons and to Grand Lodge of Saskatchewan at their annual proceedings in the coming weeks.

Wa Wa Shrine enjoyed a very successful Provincial Curling Bonspiel, hosted by the Nobles and Ladies of Goose Lake Shrine Club in Rosetown. My sincere appreciation and gratitude goes out to Noble Joe Bertrum and his tireless committee for making the weekend very enjoyable for all attending. This year a total of 18 curling teams participated, which was the best showing for the last number of years. For the first time, the Potentate's Team curled its way to an event final on Sunday however, we lost out in the end. We did not come away empty-handed though, and took home the prized and cherished "Assend" Award. Noble Vern Trail and his committee announced that next year's Provincial Bonspiel, will be held in Moose Jaw. More information will follow later in the year.

In late February, your Divan hosted a T.R.A.C. (Temple Review and Counsel) session. This is an Imperial Shrine program to review the administration and operation of our Shrine Centre and to ensure we are delivering the programs, such as Membership, Donor Relations (Fundraising and E.W.G.) and Public Relations as directed by Imperial Council and meeting their program requirements to enhance our Fraternity. Prior to this visit by an Imperial Shrine T.R.A.C. specialist (Reviewer), a long questionnaire (152 questions) was completed on all aspects of the review. Then the T.R.A.C. Specialist, Noble Phil Johnson of Al Bahr Shrine, a very qualified and active member of Membership Development for the Imperial Council of the Shrine of North America, held a review and information session with your Divan members, Past Potentates, Shrine Club



and Unit representatives. It was very encouraging to know and confirm that Wa Wa Shrine is meeting all the standards set by the Imperial Council of the A.A.O.N.M.S. Noble Johnson encouraged us to continue with our various program presentations, especially in the areas of membership and communication with our various Clubs and Units. This is the first time Wa Wa Shrine has experienced a "quality review" of our operating practices and it is encouraging to know that Wa Wa Shrine continues to be a leader amongst our peers, in the delivery of the Shrine Philanthropy to the community.

This month your Divan and Committee Chairman have been very busy preparing their various presentations on all aspects of administration, finance, insurance, membership, hospital, public relations, donor relations/fund raising, protocol, S.B.I., and circuses. Stated Session on May 26th.

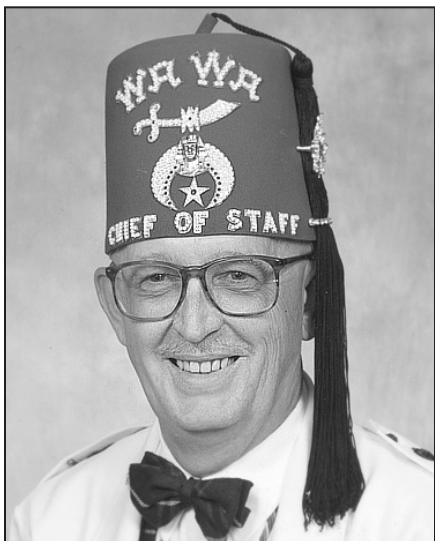

CHIEF OF STAFF REPORT



This article follows very closely with our April edition, so I just want to remind you about Ceremonial in Yorkton and MSA in Rapid City. Ceremonial details, pricing and parade are contained within this edition.

Parade units I need your responses for

parades. I am mainly dealing with the future in this article. MSA 2006 will be hosted by WA WA in Regina, August 10th - 12th, 2006. My job as Chairman, Parades & Competitions requires help and support from throughout the province. On the competition side, units from the Regina and Moose Jaw shrine clubs will be running the competitions, but I'm sure will be asking for help from similar units in other shrine clubs.

MSA has two parades, one on Thursday night and the second on Saturday morning and initial indications are large numbers of units attending from our MSA shrine centres. Here's where I need help. As WA WA no longer has a Provost unit, I am in need of 24 - 30 parade marshals. I ask non-unit nobles and nobles from the smaller shrine clubs consider taking on this task. The plan is to establish an email database of volunteers from throughout the province. The reasoning of email is because of our vast area and the lack of training time on the day of parades, everyone can be updated and know what's happening prior to their

arrival in Regina. As not everyone has email, I ask that one noble from the shrine club take on the "Corporal's" responsibility to inform his buddies. Example, Carrot River Valley Shrine Club may have three parade marshals, one of which will handle and distribute the information and updates. We know personal circumstances always change our plans, but if we have a large enough list of nobles, there will always be sufficient parade marshals.

For non unit nobles this is a great chance to become more involved in the FUN of the shrine. It only takes a couple of hours of your time, maybe once or twice a year. If you like to stand around and tell people where to go. This is the job for you.

An email link is set up on the Chief of Staff's web page for you to respond, with names, addresses and telephone numbers.

Please talk this up at your shrine clubs, as we want to show why WA WA is number one in the Midwest Shrine Association.

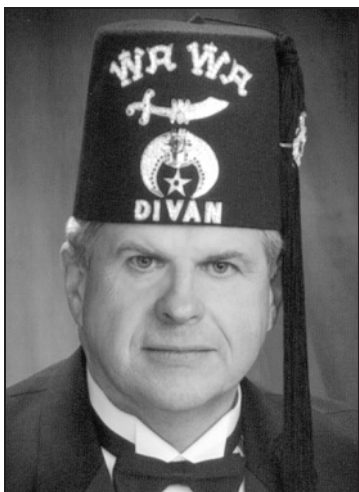

SOLICITATION FOR MASONS AND SHRINERS

Periodically discussions occur on this topic that result in an answer that is not clear as to whether a non-mason can be solicited to become a mason, and can a mason be solicited to be a shriner. The following paragraphs contain the policy of the Grand Lodge of Saskatchewan, A.F. & A. M., which appeared in the Grand Lodge of Saskatchewan, The Tracing Board of February, 2002.

In 1964, R. W. Bro. Ernest Morrell presented an article on "improper solicitations" in The Tracing Board that suggested it would not be improper to approach certain men to become masons. This was somewhat of a radical departure from the status quo, in that a candidate had to approach a member of the Fraternity about joining before anything could be said to him. Needless to say, nothing happened! In 1981, the Most Worshipful Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of England, His Royal Highness, The Duke of Kent, in dealing with this matter, ruled : "there can be no objection to a neutrally worded approach

being made to a man who is considered a suitable candidate for Freemasons. There can be no objection to his being reminded once that approach was made. The potential candidate(s) would then be left to make his own decision without further solicitation" In 1984, R. W. Bro.E. Morrell's article was reprinted. M.W. Bro. (noble) R. W. Wellman, in his Grand Master's address at the Grand Lodge of Saskatchewan Annual Communications, June, 1988 called on the Grand Master designate, Deputy Grand Master R.W. Bro (noble) D. Orr to form a special committee to provide some recommendations on solicitation. Subsequently, The Grand Lodge of Saskatchewan Editorial, Education and Development committee presented the following recommendation, which was accepted: "If you have friend, relative, or companion whom you find would make a good Mason and a good member of your Lodge; it would be proper to invite such a man to discuss an application for membership in masonry". Past Grand Master M. W. Bro. (noble) Don

Orr gave this simple guideline which speaks volumes."In all of your actions particularity in the interest and future of Freemasonry, let your conscience be your guide."

I am not aware of any policy that prohibits the soliciting of a mason to become a Shriner. In keeping with the Grand Lodge of Saskatchewan ruling you can solicit a man to be come a Mason "if you think your friend, relative or companion would make a good member of your Masonic lodge and you follow the guideline of M. W. Bro. D.Orr (PGM) that "in all of your actions, particularly in the interest and future of Freemasonry, let your conscience be your guide."

Hopefully, the foregoing will be of assistance to all masons, members of the concordant bodies and shriners when discussing membership in Freemasonry with a potential candidate(s)

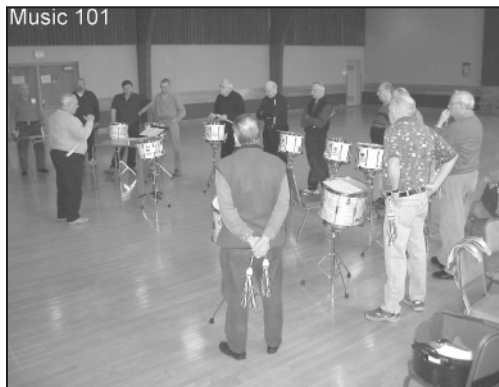

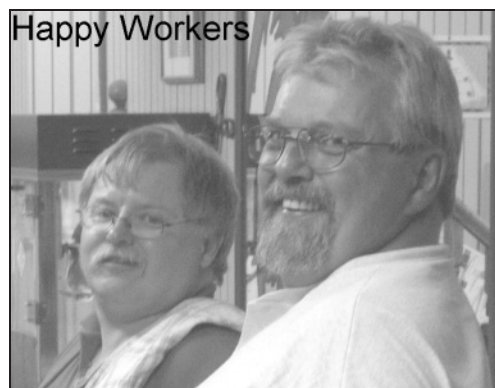

We are looking forward to the Ceremonial in Yorkton in June. See you there.

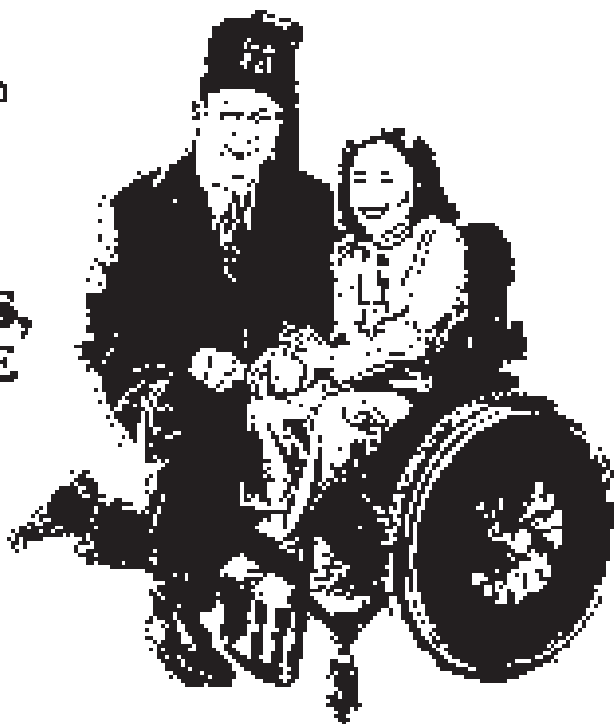
