

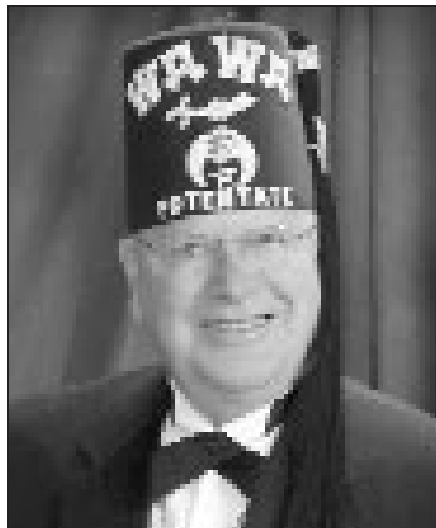

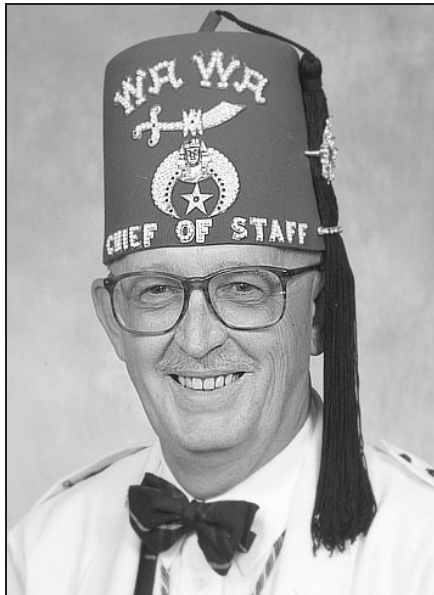

# Naming Opportunities Available to Designate Donations at Shriners Hospitals

In lieu of the traditional recognition through the United Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners of America, Shriners Hospitals for Children now offers donors a special way to recognize a loved one or a friend in a meaningful way through the naming of a physical structure.

Shriners Hospitals for Children of 17 countries and 15 states are ready to accept guidelines that will allow donations to be designated for name recognition purposes. As an honor available to suggested gift levels are: building, wing, hospital rooms, and other major public or patient areas. Generally, these systems of nomenclature will include plaques, large displays or appropriate capital expenditures.

Shriners Hospital for Children—Twin Cities was the first hospital to have a donation designated under their guidelines, with the naming of an operating room. The donor, the Kary and Linda Killinger Foundation, donated \$1 million in honor of Linda Killinger's father, Richard C. Livingston. We must all take care never to say anything which could be taken as a negative.

All Nobles should now be aware that profits are going to be split 60-40 rather than 75-25. Your club can make good money for your own needs.

# WaWa 2005-2006 Cash Calendar Report

I would like say a hearty thanks to all the Shriners and their Ladies along with the Jobies who took part in the 2005/06 Cash Calendar program. We had another banner year.

We had eight Shrine Clubs who sold out their calendar allotment and this represents 50% of all the Shrine Clubs.

When all the money and ticket stubs were in we had sold 3,285 calendars which left 214 unsold. There have been a number of you that indicated to me that we would put out a special effort next year

to sell the 3,500 calendars that we purchase. Great stuff.

The gross sales for 2005 was \$65,720.00, which returned 413,144.00 to the Shrine Clubs and \$28,806.00 to the Shrine Centre.

# Membership Report

Membership is the responsibility of every Shriner. The noted English author Herman MELVILLE once said: "We cannot live only for ourselves. A thousand fibres connect us to our fellow man." We, as Shriners, being a member of the World's Oldest Fraternity - the Masonic Family, must not only look internally to help ourselves but are encouraged to also look externally to help the Masonic order in providing candidates for their and our continuance.

During 2005, your Membership Committee participated in three successful Temple sponsored events involving membership presentations, as well as attending to matters relative to Membership. Although our main objective of having an Annual Increase of 1% in the net Membership of Wa Wa Shrine Centre, was not obtained, success was achieved as statistically outlined hereunder.

Creation - 33 - increase of 6 (22%) over 2004 (27) (goal was 8% of Membership?)

Restorations - 13 - increase of 3 (30%) over 2004 (10) (goal was 20% )

Demits - 19 - decrease of 6 (30%) from 2004 (25) (goal was 10% reduction)

Suspensions - 37 - increase of 1 (.0275%) over 2004 (goal was 10% reduction)

Deaths - 44 - increase of 3 (.075%) over 2004

During 2004, The total loss in membership was 65 Nobles (.0534% of Membership - 1222)

During 2005, The total loss in membership was 54 Nobles (.0462% of Membership - 1168)

The net loss in membership shows a net gain in loss reduction of .0072%.

One category (Death) is uncontrollable. Our initiatives regarding Creations and Restorations are satisfactory to good but we will continue to strive

for better. Demits and Suspensions are of a concern. Success was achieved in reducing the number of demits in 2005, and we we hope to reduce this number again in 2006. Of concern is the number of members being suspended annually - 36 in 2004 and 37 in 2005, a total of 73 in two years with only 23 members restored in the same two years. Had this not have occurred, an increase in our Temple's Membership of approx 30 members would resulted over the two years. Your Membership Committee will concentrate on reducing suspensions and increasing restorations, and the help of all nobles is solicited in this venture.

10 Clubs produced the 33 new Nobles whose ages range from 20 to 78 years, the average being 47.75 yrs of age.

Certificates of Appreciation have been awarded to the 24 "Top Line" signers of Membership Applications. The efforts of these nobles is greatly appreciated in assisting to create the total of 33 new members during 2005. Their participation in our Membership program includes them in the activities of the International Shrine Membership Year, June 1st., 2005 to June 10, and will assist our Temple in meeting the quota of 42 new and 14 restored members as set by our Imperial Shrine Headquarters. 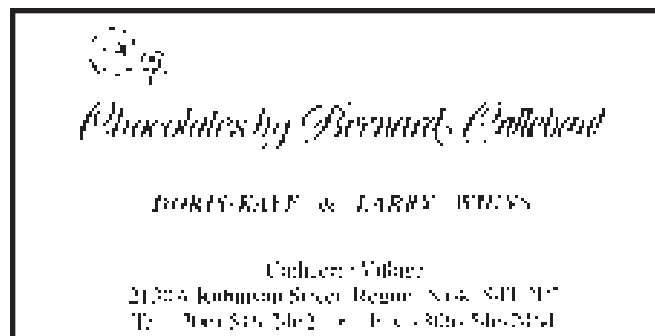
