



Our Public Relations Committee has had us before the public more than ever in the past couple of years and even more exposure is being planned. Watch for us.







Membership

Membership is the responsibility of every Shriner. During 2006, your Membership Committee participated in various programs to meet our objective of having an annual increase of 1% in the net Membership of Wa Wa Shrine temple, however, this was not obtained. Success was achieved as statistically outlined hereunder.

Creations — 24 decrease of 9 (27%) from 2005 (33)
(goal was 5% of 2005 membership)

Restorations — 8 decrease of 5 (38%) from 2005 (13)
(goal was 20% increase)

Demits — 32 increase of 13 (70% over 2005 (19)
(goal was 10% decrease)

Suspensions — 26 decrease of 11 (30%) from 2005 (37)
(goal was 10% decrease)

Deaths — 40 decrease of 4 (10%) from 2005 (goal was 10% decrease)

During 2005, the total loss in membership was 54 Nobles (.0462% of membership - 1168)

During 2006, the total loss in membership was 66 Nobles (.0598% of membership - 1102)

One category (Death) is uncontrollable. We are happy to report a 10% reduction in this category for 2006.

Although there was a decrease in creations, restoration and an increase in demits, a concentrated effort reduced the number of members who were suspended. Demits rose considerably and it is felt that whenever possible, members who qualify for life membership, should applying for same. By acquiring a life membership, a member remains active and in support of our philanthropy, not a demitted member 6 Clubs produced 24 candidates for our ceremonies. Their ages ranged from 26 to 65 years, the average being 44.5 years of age.

32 members, who assisted our Temple to surpass the quota of 42 creations and 14 restorations as set by Imperial Shrine during their Imperial Shrine Membership year, June 1, 2005 to June 10, 2006, were awarded the Imperial Shrine Membership Award (Lapel Pin).

Costs of joining remains at \$200.00 which includes the annual Temple dues. Procedures for restoring suspended and demitted members can be obtained from our Recorder. Applications for Membership are to be submitted to our Temple by May 9th, 2007 for processing for the June Ceremonial to be held June 8th and 9th, 2007.



February 4-10, 2007 Burn Awareness Week Burn Prevention Message is Loud and Clear in Cincinnati

Every year during the month of February, a week is set aside to educate people on the different aspects of burn awareness. Preventing scald injuries is the message we want to convey — not only during Burn Awareness Week but throughout the year.

Children account for more than 35 per cent of all fire and burn injuries and deaths. Every year 5,000 children are injured by scalds from tap water. Children under the age of five years are at the highest risk for burns from hot fluids. Most scald injuries happen in the kitchen from hot liquids or spills. Accidents in the kitchen and bathroom can be prevented with the proper adult supervision.

How to Avoid Scald Burns

- > Never leave a child alone in the bathroom or kitchen.
- > Cover unused electric outlets with safety devices.
- > Keep appliance cords out of reach from toddlers and children.
- > Set you water heater thermostat to 120 degrees Fahrenheit or below.
- > Consider installing water faucets and shower-heads containing

anti-scald technology.

- > Keep hot foods and liquids away from the table and counter edge.
- > Never carry or hold a child and hot foods/liquids at the same time. Statistics show there has been a significant decline in the number of pediatric burn injuries. We can all help by taking a few simple measures in our homes.



Shriners Hospital Boards Set Budget of \$721 Million

n 2007, Shriners Hospitals for Children will increase its spending for our children by \$72 million. It will cot \$1.975 million every day, or about \$23 every second, to provide our patients with expert medical care. As has been true since the first Shriners Hospital opened in 1922, all the orthopedic, burn, spinal cord injury, and cleft lip and palate treatment will be provided at no charge to our patients or their families.

The record budget is indicative of both the continuing escalation of health care costs and Shriners' dedication to the health and future of children.

"The increase budget figures reflect the escalating cost of quality health care," said Ralph Semb, Chairman of the Board of Trustees. "Despite the expense, Shriners Hospitals for Children remains committed to providing the very best care possible throughout our system. The budget also reflects a major commitment to rebuilding our facilities."

The 22 Shriners Hospitals in the U.S., Canada and Mexico have a total budget of \$721 million for 2007 Of that amount, \$655 million is designated for the hospital operating budget, which includes patient care, teaching, administrative expenses, depreciation and the daily expenses for all the Shriners Hospitals. this amount also includes \$37 million for medical research, which is an extremely important part of our mission. Since Shriners Hospitals began 40 years ago, more



than \$515 million has been dedicated to research efforts that have improved the lives of countless children worldwide.

The budget for 2007 building and equipment has been doubled to \$66 million, representing a major commitment to renovation and new construction, as well as electronic medical records and digital radiography. The

major hospital projects included in this year's plans, and their current status are:

HONOLULU — Design drawings for the replacement hospital are progressing well. Demolition of some existing structures and phase one of construcion will start in late 2007.

GALVESTON — Construction of a new parent/patient center for outpatients and their families is scheduled to start in the spring.

INTERMOUNTAIN — Construction of a new 270-space parking facility is near completion and will open in the spring.

LOS ANGELES — Negotiations are ongoing for property on which to build a replacement hospital.

PHILADELPHIA — A renovation project has been approved and is in the design phase. A new same-day surgery suite, a new radiology suite and new outpatient facilities will be created.

PORTLAND — An addition/renovation project has been approved. It includes new inpatient rooms, new operating rooms and expansion/renovation of the outpatient clinic. Design activities will start in early 2007.

ST. LOUIS — Negotiations are ongoing for property on which to build a replacement hospital.

SHREVEPORT — Expansion/renovation of the outpatient clinic is scheduled to start in the spring and be completed before the end of 2007.

Ingredients

1 box spice or German chocolate cake mix (I used Carrot)

1 box of white cake mix

1 package white sandwich cookies

1 large package vanilla instant pudding mix

a few drops of green food coloring

12 small Tootsie Rolls or equivalent

1 NEW cat-litter box

1 NEW cat-litter box liner

1 NEW pooper scooper

(I doubt this recipe for a large litter box)

1) Prepare and bake cakes mixes, according to

directions, in any size pan. Prepare pudding and chill. Crumble cookies in small batches in blender or food processor. Add a few drops of green food coloring to one cup of cookie crumbs. Mix with a fork or shake in a jar. Set aside.

- 2) When cakes are at room temperature, crumble them into a large bowl. Toss with half of the remaining cookie crumbs and enough pudding to make the mixture moist by not soggy. Place liner in litter box and pour in mixture.
- 3) Unwrap three Tootsie rolls and heat in a microwave until soft and pliable (about 10-
- 20 seconds on high). Shape the blunt ends into a slightly curved points. Repeat with three more rolls. Bury the rolls decoratively (II) in the cake mixture. Sprinkle remaining white cookie crumbs over the mixture, then scatter green crumbs lightly over top.
- 4) Heat five more Tootsie rolls until almost melted. Scrape them on top of the cake and sprinkle with crumbs from the litter box. Heat the remaining Tootsie roll until pliable and hang it over the edge of the box. Place box on a sheet of newspaper and serve with scooper. Enjoy!!

With 743 starts and 19 victories, the team has fielded drivers such as current NASCAR Craftsman Truck Series Champion Todd Bodine, Randy LaJoie, and David Green, along with a long line of NASCARs favorite drivers. Owner Frank Cicci states. "We are so excited and privileged to have such as honourable organization associated with us, we look forward to a long-lasting relationship with the Scottish Rite and Brian."

The Scottish Rite is part of the "Family of Freemasonry," the oldest and largest fraternal organization in America, dating back to 1730.


