







Our sincere thanks go to WestJet for their wonderful support of our patients and the travel fund. WestJet has donated 50 trips for patient and guardian travel. This has allowed us to build a surplus in our travel fund. I think a surplus is a necessity in case of a year of need. Even with our current surplus a burn patient or a couple of stretcher patients could put a strain on our resources. With this surplus we could also look at adding a few new patients to our roster, and at this

time we do in fact have a number of potential patients looking at our hospital system for treatment. At the present time, January 18, there are 8 patients with trips or appointments made for 2010; three of which are new patients.

In view of our healthy balance in the patient travel fund I would suggest any donations that do not need a tax receipt should be given to the general account. 


