## Recorder's Message

**HAPPY 100<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY!** Here we are in 2011, the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of WA WA Shrine. We look forward to a fun, interesting, productive and memorable year. I know your Divan, with its new members, and with your enthusiastic assistance is looking forward to great things in our endeavors to help the children.

Congratulations to all Divan members for their election to their respective offices and to the four new appointees. I want to say personally it is an honor and privilege to have been re-elected to serve as your Recorder for the coming year. Georgia and I in the office will continue in our attempt to provide you with the services you need to the best of our ability.

It is hard to believe a year has passed since I first took office. It has been an interesting year and a year of many changes. Every day something new comes in the door. As was mentioned in this space in previous issues many changes were initiated this year which, in many instances, required a rather steep learning curve that we are still on.

I want to thank you for your patience and understanding through this process. We now have a data base, while still not using 100% of its potential, we are getting better and using more of it and will continue to increase its use. Keep in mind the data base is only as good as the information in it, so if you have moved, changed phone numbers or have changed or never given us your email address, please let us know so we don't lose full contact with you. We now have a new accounting system that will streamline many of our procedures with the objective of increasing our efficiency. Following an audit this past year by the Canadian Revenue Agency, a few deficiencies were noted that needed to be corrected. They were nothing severe, unless we ignored them. Not that we were doing anything illegal, just that we were not doing them the way CRA wanted. These deficiencies have since been corrected and mostly just necessitated a change in the way some things were being done. Some accounting and reporting procedures and policies have been revised to hopefully keep you better informed as to how your Centre operates. Also, late in the year, two new computers were purchased for the office. These replaced the old piecemeal units and will assist with the efficiency and operation of the office.

2010 was a memorable year for many reasons, one of which was the visit by the Imperial Sir. I also think it was memorable for Membership. As you are likely aware the annual membership of

WA WA has been decreasing by numbers ranging from 30 to 70 members per year. We were hoping to turn that around this year and we almost made it. Thanks to our Membership Chair Noble Bill Forrest, and to all of you who aided with the recruitment, our net loss was decreased to 8 members. Well done, but we need to keep up the hard work for 2011 and end with a positive number. There are a few dates you may want to mark on your calendar for 2011. Stated Sessions will be held this year on May 11, September 7, and November 9<sup>th</sup>. Ceremonial will be in Moose Jaw June 10-12, MSA in Winnipeg August 3-6, and Imperial will be in Denver, CO July 3-7.

As always I can't get through this article without mentioning Dues. 2011 Dues were due January 1<sup>st</sup>. If you have not attended to this please do so as soon as possible. Unfortunately 28 members were suspended at this year's AGM for non payment of their 2010 dues and we truly hate to lose anyone. If there is a problem, let us know, we may be able to help.

I look forward to 2011 with great optimism and anticipation. With the hard work of your Divan and your continued enthusiasm and diligence I'm sure WA WA can have a great 100<sup>th</sup> ANNIVERSARY.

# MEET YOUR NEW DIVAN

## *Ill Sir Bevin Leipert*

Bevin Leipert was born in Melfort, Saskatchewan and lived on the family farm until the family moved to Moose Jaw, where Bevin received all of his schooling, with the exception of grade one. Hockey was the focus of Bevin's childhood and young adult years. He played a partial year with the Moose Jaw Canucks before being loaned to the Dauphin Kings of the Manitoba Junior League. The next year, Bevin journeyed to Bemidji, Minnesota, where he graduated from College and played College hockey, as well as coaching the Junior High School team one year and being Assistant Coach for the College Junior Team for another year.

Bevin returned to Moose Jaw to work for his father's Auto Parts business. After two months in Moose Jaw, he relocated to Maple Creek, where the business had purchased another branch. Bevin became the playing coach of the senior team in Maple Creek that winter. Becoming restless, Bevin ventured to Melbourne, Australia where he worked and played hockey for three years. In 1975, he returned to Canada to once again work for his father at a summer resort at Kenosee Lake, Sask. That fall, the Moose Jaw Canuck Junior Team

hired Bevin where he became coach and general manager for two seasons.

Bevin's brother, Brian, convinced him to join the life insurance industry with London Life. The Leipert Financial Group, with offices in Regina and Moose Jaw, now employs 20 people and specializes in business insurance, succession and estate planning. The employee benefits division of LFG is called Argus Employee Benefits and serves more than 150 companies in Western Canada.

Bevin and Lady Vi have four children. Son Trent is a Doctoral candidate at the University of Chicago in the field of Musicology. There were two changes made to the administration of the Patient Transportation Fund in 2010:

- 1) The introduction of a daily stipend of \$20 to help defray some of the costs for meals while travelling. It appears that WA WA was the only Temple that was not contributing to the patients' meal costs.
- 2) A travel allowance to out of town patients travelling to either Regina or Saskatoon in order to access air transportation. These changes were made possible due to a large endowment made to the Patient Transportation Fund.

# KIDS KORNER

Hi, I'm Shaylee Rosnes. I live in Moose Jaw, I'm in grade 8 at St. Michael School, I am 13 years old, and I have Cerebral Palsy. I have been going to the Shriners Hospital since I was four. That was when they did a surgery called a Rhizotomy on me. Long story short, they cut a few nerves to lessen the spasticity in my body. After the surgery, I stayed at the Shriners' Hospital for 2 months. During that time I was given physical and occupational therapy. But it wasn't all therapy, there was lots of fun stuff to do too. I even made a few new friends. When I was allowed to go home, I almost didn't want too. But it was good to see my family again. Ever since then I've had to go back every six months. The last time I went was at the end of November.



Not only did the check up on how I was walking and moving in general. They also wanted to see if my spondilolisthesis, - which means my vertebrae are slipping or if the curve in my spine, was getting any worse. Luckily, these aren't getting any worse. But the specialist still wants to see me every year, just in case. The other doctor I went to see said my hips were getting a little tight though. I'll have to start doing some exercises to fix that. While I was there I also got some new braces for my feet made. They examined pretty much everything I did, and gave me some tips on how I could walk straighter. I can't wait until I go back again, hopefully with some improvement to show for all their hard work. Thank You Shriners!

The parents of five year old David Rheault, a boy with Cerebral Palsy affecting all four limbs, contacted the WA WA Shrine when David was three. They knew that the Shriners provide services through their Hospitals. During the initial interview with them to complete their application they, like most parents I had the pleasure of meeting were clear that their primary interest was to get a specialist to look at David to see if there were any surgical or pharmaceutical treatments they could pursue to help him. They had been able to borrow a specialized walker from the Rehabilitation Hospital in Regina for a few weeks. However, they needed a long-term solution. David was accepted by the Shriners Hospital in Montreal. In November 2008, David and his mom traveled to Montreal to visit the Shriners specialist. The answer was both reassuring and disappointing. There were no magic solutions to David's condition - no pills or surgeries that would help. On the other hand, David had no bone alignment problems that are often

associated with cerebral palsy and that can cause deformation and pain. It meant a lot to David's parents to have one of North America's top experts in



cerebral palsy reaffirm that David was in relatively good health and they were doing the right things for him. As a bonus, the physiotherapist they saw at the Shriners hospital offered to loan them the type of walker David needed. Because of the Shriners' generosity, David was able to use the walker to

play and interact with other kids at his preschool. It made a big difference in his quality of life. Between his school walker and the outdoor walker his grandpa built for him to use at home, David is a young boy on the move.

His parents, Pam and Sylvain, have kept in touch over the last three years sending photos and information about his great progress. The loan of the specialized walker from the Montreal Hospital helped make this progress possible for although he outgrew the Shriners walker this past summer, that little yellow Pony walker gave him legs for two years.

We, as Shriners can be proud of the fact that although our Hospital was unable to provide medical services to David, their generosity greatly assisted him to become, as he is today, "A five year-old on the go!"

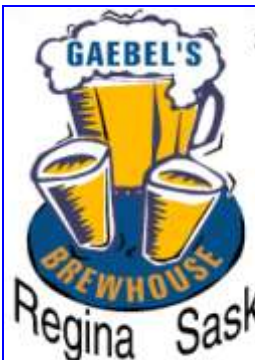

## 2011 Burn Awareness Week Campaign

Shriners Hospitals for Children® Emphasizes Prevention,  
during Burn Awareness Week

Burn prevention is a key endeavor of Shriners Hospitals for Children®, which is why the health care system began its Burn Awareness campaigns more than 20 years ago.

### Safety Begins at Home

Our homes are our personal “safe havens,” where we can relax, be ourselves, and enjoy time with our families. However, without some attention and awareness, our homes can also be dangerous places, especially for children.

*Consider these facts:*

- Every day, across the U.S., hundreds of children are taken to emergency rooms for treatment of scald burns caused by contact with hot liquids, steam or foods.
- Approximately 65 percent of children under age 4 hospitalized for burn injuries were scalded by hot liquids.
- Approximately 16,000 children under age 5 are treated in U.S. hospitals for scald burns annually.
- Ninety-five percent of scalds occur in residences.
- Fire causes the death of more than 600 children ages 14 and under each year, and injures about 3,000 more.
- Nearly 50 percent of children injured in fires or fire-related incidents are under age 5.

More than 60 percent of residential fires that cause the death of a child occur in homes without smoke detectors. Many of these injuries could have been easily prevented. Clearly, burn awareness and prevention is critically important to the safety and well-being of everyone, especially children.

Shriners Hospitals for Children®, which operates the only freestanding hospitals dedicated to the treatment of pediatric burns, is committed to decreasing the number of preventable pediatric burn injuries by raising awareness and

providing educational materials, especially to parents and families. The health care system uses Burn Awareness Week (the first full week of February every year) to kick off its year-long awareness campaign.

The 2011 campaign, Burn Awareness: Safety Begins at Home, emphasizes the importance of observing basic precautions to keep everyone – especially children – safe at home.

Keeping children safe from burn injuries at home requires constant vigilance, including making sure to have proper warning equipment, such as smoke detectors, and keeping them in good working order. It is also critically important to have an escape plan in the event a fire does occur.

The Stop Burn Injuries (SBI) program provided by WA WA Shriners, travels to small communities promoting burn awareness in and around the home. This training is provided to children from K to grade five. Local fire departments also assist in providing this training. We are also fortunate to have SGI Canada as a major sponsor of the program.

School visits have already commenced in 2011 with presentations at Pangman, Ogema and Bengough Elementary Schools reaching a total of 135 children.

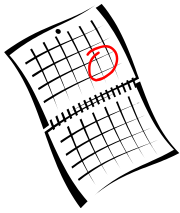
