





DONOR RELATIONS

The WA WA Shrine Building fund was started in 1996 as one method to help pay for the ongoing building maintenance of the Shrine building. A minimum donation amount was set at one hundred dollars and each donation was recognized with the placement of a gold fez plaque inscribed with the name of the donor. Currently two framed boards, each holding 135 gold fezzes, are located inside the entrance of the Shrine Centre. Records indicate that only twelve donations have been made to this fund in the last three years.

WA WA Shriners recognize that our building is getting older and that the cost of general maintenance is increasing yearly. In 2010 there was a roof repair alone that exceeded eighty thousand dollars. The Divan has formed a committee to monitor this situation and to determine possible solutions for the future. One possible way to deal with the increasing costs of maintenance is to revive the WA WA Shrine Building Fund. It would be of tremendous help if half to two thirds of the current WA WA membership donated annually to this fund. If not a viable option at this time, please consider a gift in your will.

Our membership has been in decline for about two decades. We now feel that it is beginning to turn around and slowly but surely increase. WA WA Shrine Centre is our home. Regardless of where you live in the province, you come to the Centre for special Shrine events. Our building is a place where you meet old friends and make new ones, have fun, and support our philan-

thropy.

The building fund is not a registered charity, but is a receipt for tax purposes the most important concern? Personally, I don't think so. The company we keep and the new friends we make are far more important in ensuring that we continue to support the children from our province who are attending our Shrine hospitals (or may in the future). This is the reason we are Shriners.




