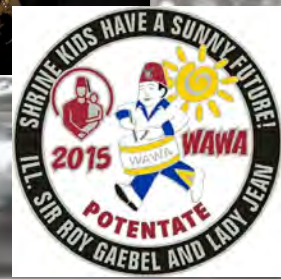

## Hospital Report

Having the Farmers Market in the Shrine Centre has created more awareness of the work done by Shriners and our hospital system. This has already lead to one application for the Hospital in Montreal and I expect more to come from this source.

Patient travel was comparable to last year. There were 57 trips for the year versus 56 trips in the prior year. The trips are broken down by club as follows:

West Jet generously donated 160 one way travel vouchers for patient travel in 2014. This has a monetary value in excess of \$50 thousand dollars as reported on the Patient Transportation Fund's financial statements. As we received the vouchers early in the calendar year we were able to utilize 158 vouchers. Since we didn't want to see any go unused we transferred the last two to the Khartoum Temple for their patient travel.

During January an emergency burn patient was referred to WA WA for treatment at Shriners Hospital Cincinnati. Within 48 hours of the patient acceptance an air ambulance disembarked from Cincinnati to transport the patient from Regina. The cost of the one-way flight was \$21,500 US.

Construction of the new Hospital in Montreal is on schedule and on budget. The dedication ceremonies will be held this coming August. As reported on the website fund raising has reached \$119 million of the \$130 million goal at year end.

The hospital held its 4th annual charity golf event raising a total of \$506,000. The 5th annual event will be held on August 10<sup>th</sup>. This event has proven to be extremely successful as has sold out every year.

Lastly I would like to draw your attention to two upcoming special events. One that is being held locally and the other one in Montreal. Our Hospital Patient Ambassador (Carter Brown) along with his good friend Anthony Cavillo (former CFL all-star quarterback) will be holding an event titled "An Evening with Good Friends". Carter and Anthony will be sharing their incredible journeys and the wonderful story of their friendship. The event will be held on March 20 at the Delta Hotel. Tickets are \$100 with all proceeds going to Shriners Hospital for Children Canada.

The second event is The One & Only Inaugural Ball 2015 being held in Montreal October 3. The Honorary Presidents for the event are Joey & Carmie Saputo. Joey Saputo is the President of Montreal Impact; which is Montreal's professional soccer team. Proceeds from the event are going to Shriners Hospital for Children Canada. The goal from the event is to raise one million dollars.

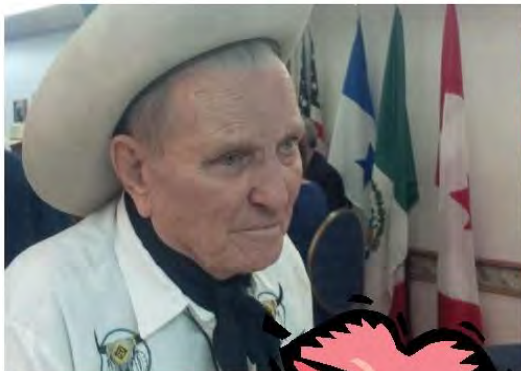


## MOOSE JAW SHRINE CHRISTMAS PARTY 2014

December 6, 2014

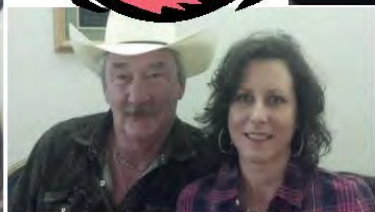

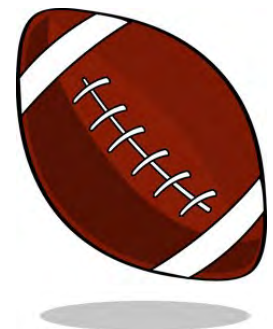

## Ladies Auxiliary 90 Years Ago

Ill. Sir Albert Olson asked some of the Shrine Ladies to form an Auxiliary to help furnish the Shriners Hospital for crippled children in Winnipeg, with the necessary linen and clothing for children under treatment. The other function was to assist the Wa Wa Temple with social functions.

Lady S.C. Burton was the 1st president, 32 members were present at the first meeting on Wednesday May 6th in 1925. Dues were \$1.00. The executive met in June to write the constitution.

In February 1926 the executive sent a letter to the wives of all Shriners outside of Moose Jaw, Saskatoon and Regina asking them to form Auxiliaries or join those already formed. By 1929 there were 9 Auxiliaries in the province fundraising money with teas, plays, dances and bridge tournaments.

In the early years the Auxiliary was dedicated to sewing bedding and clothing for the hospital. They made everything from surgeon's gowns to rompers, sweaters, bibs, socks, wash cloths and night gowns.

The Ladies of WA WA continue to support the Shrine Hospitals, the WA WA Temple and the Shriners with their time, money and enthusiasm for 90 years.

# Spring & Summer Safety

## Scooter, Bike and Pedestrian Safety

- a comfortable, properly fitted helmet bearing the label of an independent testing lab. Be sure that the helmet sits level on top of the head—not rocking in any direction—and always fasten the safety strap.
- Be sure that safety gear (wrist, elbow and kneepads) fits properly and does not interfere with the rider's movement, vision or hearing. Wrist pads are not recommended for scooter riders as they may affect their ability to maneuver.
- Ride scooters and bikes only on smooth, paved surfaces and only ride during daylight hours. Learn the proper hand signals and use them when you turn or stop.
- Come to a complete stop before entering driveways, paths or sidewalks, then look left, right and left again for bikes, cars or pedestrians heading your way.
- Teach crossing safety to children by example

## Barbeque Safety

- Always supervise a bbq grill when in use
- Keep children and pets far away from grills
- With charcoal grills, only use charcoal starter fluids designed for bbq grills and don't add fluid after coals have been lit
- With gas grills, be sure the hose connection is tight and check for leaks. Soapy water to the hoses will easily & safely reveal any leaks.
- Always follow the manufacturer's instructions & have grill repaired by a professional. Spare propane should never be stored indoors

## Water Safety

- Only swim in approved areas
- Always supervise children near water at all times and make sure that children learn to swim
- Always wear an approved PFD (personal floatation device) when doing water sports. Air-filled swimming aids are not substitutes for approved PFDs. An adult should always supervise children using these devices
- Be sure to extinguish all smoking materials and shut down motors, fans & heating devices before fueling a boat. In case of spill, wipe up fuel immediately and check the bilge for leakage and odors. After fueling and before starting the boat, ventilate with the blower for at least 4 minutes

## Camping Safety Tips

- Always use a flame retardant tent and set up camp far away from the campfire
- Only use flashlights or battery- powered lanterns inside the tent or any other closed space, not liquid- filled heaters and lanterns
- Always build your campfire down wind away from your tent. Clear all vegetation and dig a pit surrounded by rocks before building your campfire
- Store liquid fire starter (not gasoline) away from your tent and campfire and only use dry kindling to freshen a campfire
- Always put out a campfire when going to sleep or leaving a campsite. To extinguish the fire, cover with dirt or pour water over it

## WA WA Temple

### **Pre Authorized Membership Dues Payment Plan**

WA WA Temple has implemented an Automatic Dues Payment Program for annual membership dues. This program is being recommended and adopted by more and more temples throughout North America, as a method to reduce administrative costs and thereby keep our membership dues as low as possible.

If you already are having any utility bills or other bill payments being done by direct withdrawal from your bank account, then you are already familiar with this concept. For those of you who are not familiar with this process, the basics are that a noble will grant permission for the Temple to withdraw quarterly payments throughout the year and subsequent years, directly from a nobles bank account in order to pay for annual WA WA membership or PCM dues as stipulated in the Temple bylaws.

Members may enroll at any time during the year. Payments would commence in the first possible quarter (March, June, September, December) and the first payment would depend on the date enrolled. For example – assuming 2014 Member dues \$96.00 (as per Temple Bylaw's)

Subsequent year's membership dues would be deducted on the last banking day of March, June, Sept, and Dec 31 at an amount equal to one quarter of the annual dues for the upcoming calendar year as per Temple Bylaws.

All electronic information is retained ONLY on the Bank of Nova Scotia secure website – no electronic banking information is maintained on any WA WA computer. The signed authorization forms will be stored in a safety deposit box at the Bank of Nova Scotia

To enroll in this plan, please sign the form on the reverse side of this page and return to the Recorder along with a voided cheque. If you no longer use cheques, your bank can supply you with a Pre Authorized Payment form that can be sent to us.

For those of you who are wondering why payments through credit cards are being discouraged, it is due to the fact that the administrative costs plus credit card processing costs far exceed the currently purposed method.
