HOSPITAL REPORT

As of October 18, 2016

The following table outlines activities in the PATIENT TRANSPORTATION FUND year to date:

- 4 additional patients flights were booked from Sept 9 to Oct 10 to our Montreal Hospital.
- The clubs these Shrine Kids were from is North Battleford (2), Saskatoon (1) and Estevan (1).
- Three (3) of the flights were booked using 12 vouchers. The monetary cost of these vouchers was \$355.56. A fourth flight was billed to the Patient Transportation Fund (PTF) Visa card for \$1028.00.
- To date a total of 136 of the allotted vouchers have been utilized for a total monetary value of \$43,963.56.

I am happy to announce that our 7 year old Shrine Kid from Prince Albert returned to Philadelphia in late September and had her external fixator removed. She currently is undergoing intrusive physiotherapy, her left leg has been adequately lengthened and straightened. On October 5th, I received an email from her grandmother which read, "Addi walking for her first time since Surgery."

REPORT ON PRE-AUTHORIZED PAYMENT PLAN (PAPP)

The PAP has been in operation for about two years. Currently there are 200 Nobles enrolled in the program. The Divan decided to implement the program to help Nobles keep their dues current. The program has had some start up problems largely technical in nature, eg Double payments that the bank inadvertently made. We apologize for the inconvenience and anxiety this has caused and we thank you for your patience and understanding.

This year the PAP significantly reduced the number of Nobles for Non-payment of dues. We currently have less than twenty that is the fewest in many years. Staff in the Recorder's office put in several hours on the phone contacting Nobles for payment. Nobles our Administration would be more productive if we did not have to spend this extra time. In addition Shriner's International collect the per capita dues of \$30 per Noble, 50% in March, 35% in June and 15% in October. In short it costs WA WA money.

The PAP is there for Nobles that find it difficult to pay by January 1st each year. Withdrawals of \$33.75 are made in March, June, Sept and Dec.

This program does not apply to those Nobles who pay their dues on or before January 1st each year. The program is **not mandatory**, however the Divan and the Membership Committee strongly urge Nobles to take advantage of it. It is a WIN – WIN first for the Noble not to worry about dues and second for WA WA not to collect unpaid dues.

If you would like to participate in the program, the 2017 membership dues must be paid in full before March 2017 when the first PAPP withdrawal is made for 2018 dues. An application form is available on page 31. Complete and forward to the WA WA office with a void cheque.



STOP BURN INJURIES

Once again the SBI team has been very active. The SBI team has been to eleven schools and made presentations to 1,120 children. Ten of these schools were in the Parkland area and the other was in the Carrot River Valley Area. Schools visited were: St. Henry School Melville, Miller School Melville, Springside School, St. Theodore School, Churchbridge Public School, Saltcoats School, Chief Gabriel Cote Ed. Centre, Keeseekoose Chiefs Ed. Centre, Esterhazy P.J. Gillen School, Langenburg Hoffman School and Tisdale Elementary School. We may have some more this fall.



When we visit these schools there is in most cases the local media who submit articles about our visit. This is good for the Shriners as some of the local papers have a distribution of 10,000 readers plus. This not only informs the public about what the schools are doing, but it also gives the Shriners good exposure. So as you can see we get coverage over a large area. This may

help to bring in new Shriners.

Once again SGI Canada donated money to the SBI program. This year they donated \$2,000.00 towards supplies for handouts that we give to the children. Thank you SGI Canada.



ENJOY A SAFE CHRISTMAS HOLIDAY

Candles and Fireplaces

Increased use of candles and fireplaces, combined with an increase in the amount of combustible seasonal decorations can present more risks for fire.

- o Never leave burning candles unattended or sleep in a room with a lit candle
- o Keep candles out of reach of children
- o Make sure candles are on stable surfaces
- o Don't burn candles near trees, curtains or any other flammable items
- o Don't burn trees, wreaths or wrapping paper in the fireplace
- o Check and clean the chimney and fireplace area at least once a year

Even Angel Hair can Hurt

Putting up decorations is one of the best ways to get in a holiday mood; however accidents occur during this season.

- "Angel hair" is made from spun glass, and it can irritate your eyes and skin; always wear gloves when handling it, or substitute nonflammable cotton
- When spraying artificial snow on windows or other surfaces, be sure to follow directions carefully; these sprays can irritate your lungs if inhaled
- Decorate the tree with your kids in mind;
 move ornaments that are breakable or
 have metal hooks toward the top

- o Always use the proper step ladder; don't stand on chairs or other furniture
- Lights are among the best parts of holiday decorating; make sure there are no exposed or frayed wires, loose connections or broken sockets
- Make sure paths are clear indoors so older adults do not trip on wrapping paper, decorations, toys, etc.;
- NSC provides tips for older adults on slip, trip and fall protections

Traveling for the Holidays? Be Prepared

Many people choose to travel during the holidays by automobile, follow these tips for a safe trip. Use a designated driver to ensure guests make it home safely after a holiday party. Alcohol or over-the-counter or illegal drugs all cause impairment.

- Make sure every person in the vehicle is properly buckled up no matter how long or short the distance being traveled.
- o Use a food thermometer to make sure meat is cooked to a safe temperature
- o Put that cell phone away; distracted driving causes one-quarter of all crashes
- o Make sure the vehicle is properly maintained, and keep an emergency kit with you
- o Be prepared for heavy traffic, and possibly heavy snow

Holiday food safety tips:


- o Do not rinse raw meat and poultry before cooking
- o Use a food thermometer to make sure meat is cooked to a safe temperature
- o Refrigerate food within two hours
- o Leftovers are safe for four days in the refrigerator
- Bring sauces, soups and gravies to a rolling boil when reheating

- o When storing turkey, be sure to cut the leftovers in small pieces so it will chill quicker
- Wash your hands frequently when handling food

<u>Membership Dues Pre Authorized Payment Plan - PAPP</u>

WA WA Temple has implemented an Automatic Dues Payment Program for annual membership dues. This program is being recommended and adopted by more and more temples throughout North America, as a method to reduce administrative costs and thereby keep our membership dues as low as possible.

If you already are having any utility bills or other bill payments being done by direct withdrawal from your bank account, then you are already familiar with this concept. For those of you who are not familiar with this process, the basics are that a noble will grant permission for the Temple to withdraw quarterly payments throughout the year and subsequent years, directly from a nobles bank account in order to pay for annual WA WA membership or PCM dues as stipulated in the Temple bylaws.

Members may enroll at any time during the year. Payments would commence in the first possible quarter (March, June, September, December) and the first payment would depend on the date enrolled. Breakdown below for Regular member status (as per Temple Bylaw's) for pre-payment of 2017 Member dues at \$135.00

Subsequent year's membership dues would be deducted on the last banking day of March, June, Sept, and Dec 31 at an amount equal to one quarter of the annual dues for the upcoming calendar year as per Temple Bylaws.

All electronic information is retained ONLY on the Bank of Nova Scotia secure website – no electronic banking information is maintained on any WA WA computer. The signed authorization forms will be stored in a safety deposit box at the Bank of Nova Scotia

To enroll in this plan, please sign the form at the end of this issue and return to the Recorder along with a voided cheque. If you no longer use cheques, your bank can supply you with a Pre Authorized Payment form that can be sent to us.

For those of you who are wondering why payments through credit cards are being discouraged, it is due to the fact that the administrative costs plus credit card processing costs far exceed the currently purposed method.


