It is hard to believe I am in my sixth year on the Divan and almost 3 months as Potentate. Lady Irene and I want to express our sincere thank you for all the support the Nobles and Ladies across WA WA and especially the Saskatoon Shrine Club, have extended to us on this journey. Our Ambassadors that stepped up to help are nothing short of amazing, especially when

you have Noble Dennis Skuce and Lady Vivian on your team.

Nobles and Ladies of WA WA, can be really proud of the support they have given to the Montreal Shriner's New Hospital campaign. In 2011, the Divan, agreed to pledge giving \$160,000 over ten years. As of December 2016 the donations made by WA WA and individual gifts totaled \$778,067. In addition to that there were donations by individuals and clubs that were made direct which totaled \$222,680. This includes the Saskatoon Shrine Club donation of \$50,000. The grand total donations from WA WA and one made direct total \$1,000,747. We have a commitment of \$38,237 remaining. In May Lady Irene and I along with Noble Sandomirsky will be attending the Hospital Seminar, at which time we will present a cheque for all or almost the pledge remaining. Wow, \$1,000,000 thanks goes out to the generous people.

Last fall we appointed a fundraising committee that is chaired by Chief Rabban, Noble Wayne Flaten. They are being challenged to find fundraising schemes for WA WA and the Clubs that will replace losses of Circus revenues. We only have two fundraisers going, in addition to the 55% share that clubs commit and membership dues. Cash Calendar sales netted \$33,806 on sales of \$74,169. The Telemarketer last year proposed to continue seeking out donations

HOSPITAL REPORT

Since my report of Feb. 21, at which time we had 97 patient files consisting of 77 active and 20 inactive Shrine Kids, we have gained 3 new patients and 1 reinstated patient, for a total of 101 Shrine Kids files.

The 3 new Shrine kids were (1) LW with a diagnosis of Arthrogryposis, (2) SS with diagnosis of Vacterl Association and (3) TC with a diagnosis of Cerebral Palsy and Scoliosis.

The reinstated "Shrine Kid" is a 25 year old adult male, BP, with a diagnosis of Perthes Disease, whom will be discussed later in the report.

Since our last report, 11 new flights were booked for 9 Shrine Kids, 2 of whom had 2 flights each. 9 of these flights for 7 clients went to Montreal. 3 of these had diagnoses of avascular necrosis of the hip (1), scoliosis (1), and osteogenesis imperfect (1). The other 4 of 7 had diagnoses as were mentioned earlier.

A total of 24 vouchers were used for these 9 flights, with a numerical value of \$7447.90. We have used a total of 44 vouchers to date this year of 148 vouchers allotted. These have a numerical value of \$14, 522.64.

The two remaining flights of the 11 booked were for trips to the USA. One was to Minneapolis costing \$2596.40, and the other to Cincinnati costing \$1313.30. Both were paid on our Visa card.

We have 11 new applicants still awaiting decisions on acceptance or rejection. These potential Shrine kids are at various stages of their submission.

Finally, our one reinstated "Shrine Kid" is a 25 year old adult male from Regina. His diagnosis is Legg-Perthes Disease. This condition is prevalent in males, and usually presents between the ages of 5 and 10 years. It affects the hip joint, a ball, and socket joint. It occurs as a result of a transient loss of blood flow to the round ball, the top of the femur or thigh bone. There is destruction of the ball with fracturing. It usually causes hip and leg pain, and loss of joint motion.

This client had a visit at age 23 in 2015, and is booked for another visit later this month. As our cut -off age is usually 21, I wondered why he was still being followed, so I telephoned him. He told me he had a new surgical procedure done at age 8, and subsequently had many more procedures over the years. However he was very active as a teen, and played rugby and football, and also did swimming and biking.

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New Patient Referral Process Approved at Imperial Session



Great news! It is now easier than ever to refer a patient to Shriners Hospitals for Children®! At the 138th Annual Session in July 2012, the attending delegates approved amendments to the Colorado Bylaws 509.2 and 509.3 which simplified the way for patients to access Shriners Hospitals. Patients/families no longer need to fill out a two-page application form that must be processed before being considered for treatment. While this is a big change for our system and YOU, we want to assure you that our Shriners are more important than ever in finding children that need our help; as well as informing the public about the noble mission of Shriners Hospitals for Children. We need your participation now, more than ever, to reach more patients. This new process makes it easier for our patients and will still allow for engagement with the nobility. Travel and transportation support should not change. Contact your Shrine temple or hospital if you have questions.

This new intake process continues to support your valuable referrals, without the added step of completing a patient application. Instead, simply provide patients/families with the Shriners Hospitals for Children patient referral card, which may be obtained from your hospital or Shrine temple. In addition, a new Patient Referral Form will be forthcoming in the near future. However, the referral card is preferred, with the patient/family calling the hospital's referral intake line directly. Why? This is the quickest and most convenient way for a patient to get the care they need.

When did this start? In October 2012, Shriners Hospitals simplified the process for our new patients; allowing patients' immediate scheduling for an appointment if their clinical needs meet the hospital's scope of service. To avoid any confusion to our patients or the community, temple staff are asked to no longer use the application form and remove any reference to a patient application process in temple materials or website. Thank you for your continued hard work in helping the children. Please contact your local Shriners Hospitals facility if you have any questions.

STOP BURN INJURIES (SBI)

The SBI program is alive and well for the time being. Year 2017 looks promising as we are off to a good start, five schools and 454 children, with two more schools scheduled for early May. On April 27th and 28th LeRoy Charbonneau and I will be attending the SAFC (Sask. Association of Fire Chiefs) Seminar in Prince Albert. We are invited every year, plus we are given a complimentary booth and a couple of meals. This is great expo-

sure as this seminar is attended by the volunteer fire department Chiefs in rural Saskatchewan. These men and women are instrumental in helping promote our being at the schools in their areas.

The key to making a presentation at the schools is the approach made by Shriners in their respective areas. For example, Parkland Shrine Club SBI representative Noble Leroy Charbonneau approaches the schools in the Parkland area. Leroy speaks with the

principals about the program we offer; once permission is granted for the presentation Leroy contacts me and plans are made to be at the school. In 2016/2017 Leroy made arrangements for presentations at 15 schools in the Parkland area. Leroy also contacts the local fire department, local media and SGI Canada if a representative is in the area. We are now set to go. I

bring with me one or two available members of the Regina SBI team. At the present time this includes Ron Heal. Lloyd Ramsdell, Garth and Neale Haack and Lady Betty Eskdale.

Prior to the presentation I speak with the principals and hand them cards that list the services the Shriners provide. This is important as they know if someone in the community requires assistance. I stress that this service is of no cost to parents. I also

speak to the news reporters and give them a hand-out that tells them who we are and what we do, that way they get it right.

Last, but not least, I speak to the fire fighters about their participation, if they wish to do or say something. Now, it's presentation time. Once the presentation is over, each student is given a handout package containing a colouring book, pencil, crayons, rulers and "hot and cold" faucet stickers.

All students receive a certificate acknowledging that they have participated in Stop Burn Injury Training.

In the past SGI Canada has been a major sponsor which has provided funding to purchase the above needed supplies. We have received approximately \$30K from them. We are not sure about this year due to a tight provincial budget. I also receive some materials from Shriners International free of charge.

WA WA DRUM CORPS DONATES \$10,000







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KEN'S SAFETY CORNER

Spring is here and it's a good time to be outside enjoying the weather. Here are some ways to help keep you and your loved ones healthy.

1. Beware and aware of BUGS! Mosquitoes, ticks, and fleas transmit diseases. Use appropriate

Insect repellent. Avoid tick infested areas such as high grass or thick brush. Shower as soon as possible after coming indoors and check your body for ticks. Check your children.

Wash and tumble dry clothing. Check pets for ticks. Consult your health care provider if you or a family member develops fever, rash, body aches, headache, stiff neck, fatigue or disorientation after a tick bite. Typically these symptoms occur in the first three weeks after a tick bite.

2. Grilling out?

Use a meat thermometer to make sure meats are cooked thoroughly. Place cooked meat on a clean

platter not back on the one that held raw meats. Wash hands, kitchen utensils and any surfaces that have been in contact with raw meats as soon as possible. Good rule: Keep **HOT foods HOT** and **COLD foods COLD**.

3. In the SUN....

Do your part to protect yourself and your family from illnesses that are transmitted when

participating in recreational water activities. Do not swim if you have diarrhea, do not swallow pool water, wash your hands frequently. Avoid being directly in the sun during the hottest time of the day. Use sunscreen at least SPF 15, cover skin with clothing and wear a wide brimmed hat. Wear sunglasses to protect your eyes (UVA and UVB rays). Always be aware of signs of heat stress.

4. Spending time with Nature....

Drinking stream water even though it looks clear is risky business. Clear doesn't mean safe.

Cryptosporidium and Giardia are parasites that inhabit water. They are not visible and can cause

significant illness. Always filter or treat water to make it safe for drinking.

Protect yourself from bats. Bats enjoy the night life. Bats are a common sight at dusk when

camping. Remind children to never touch a bat. Bats may be infected with rabies. If bitten, wash the area well and seek immediate medical attention.

Membership Dues Pre Authorized Payment Plan - PAPP

WA WA Temple has implemented an Automatic Dues Payment Program for annual membership dues. This program is being recommended and adopted by more and more temples throughout North America, as a method to reduce administrative costs and thereby keep our membership dues as low as possible.

If you already are having any utility bills or other bill payments being done by direct withdrawal from your bank account, then you are already familiar with this concept. For those of you who are not familiar with this process, the basics are that a noble will grant permission for the Temple to withdraw quarterly payments throughout the year and subsequent years, directly from a nobles bank account in order to pay for annual WA WA membership or PCM dues as stipulated in the Temple bylaws.

Members may enroll at any time during the year. Payments would commence in the first possible quarter (March, June, September, December) and the first payment would depend on the date enrolled. Breakdown below for Regular member status (as per Temple Bylaw's) for pre-payment of 2018 Member dues at \$135.00

Subsequent year's membership dues would be deducted on the last banking day of March, June, Sept, and Dec 31 at an amount equal to one quarter of the annual dues for the upcoming calendar year as per Temple Bylaws.

All electronic information is retained ONLY on the Bank of Nova Scotia secure website – no electronic banking information is maintained on any WA WA computer. The signed authorization forms will be stored in a safety deposit box at the Bank of Nova Scotia

To enroll in this plan, please sign the form at the end of this issue and return to the Recorder along with a voided cheque. If you no longer use cheques, your bank can supply you with a Pre Authorized Payment form that can be sent to us.

For those of you who are wondering why payments through credit cards are being discouraged, it is due to the fact that the administrative costs plus credit card processing costs far exceed the currently purposed method.
