

A MESSAGE FROM YOUR POTENTATE 2017

The 2017 Ceremonial is now behind us. While the numbers were small, the Class of 2017 will be a wonderful addition to the WA WA Nobility and Ladies. The Warman parade was a huge success with eleven WA WA Units participating. It was truly an honor to lead our Shrine Units before of a huge crowd along the six kilometer route. The Saskatoon Shrine Club hosted the event under the leader-

ship of Noble Craig Inkster and Captain of the Units Noble Art Hunter. Thanks for the memorable weekend.

Lady Irene and I along with Chief Rabban Noble Wayne and Lady Synde Flaten, Noble Brad and Lady Leeann, and Noble Bob and Lady Lizz Keep attended the Imperial Session at Daytona Beach, Florida. The Session dealt with a number of Legislative items. The one that affected Canadian Temples the most was that we are now required to pay all per capita dues and Hospital levies in USA currency. The per capita dues are now \$30 per year and the Hospital levy is \$5. WA WA dues are currently \$100 plus the \$35 which to date have been paid in Canadian currency. Effective August 1st the exchange rate was set at 1.2532%. WA WA must remit \$37.60 for per capita dues and \$6.26 Hospital Levy.

During my travels on the Divan I have heard Nobles say they are not active in the Shrine for many reasons and that they are considering a demit. I believe we all need to be reminded once in a while that "As Shriners, we look beyond ourselves to serve the needs of others, especially children who cannot help themselves. We believe Shriners Hospitals to be the world's greatest philanthropy and we covenant with each other to support its temples of mercy with SPIR-IT, TIME, TALENT AND MEANS."

WA WA SHRINERS MEMBERSHIP DUES 2018

During the 2017 Imperial Session, legislation was passed requiring all payments made to Shriners International be made in US Dollars. Beginning with the 2018 dues notice, and with all new candidates and restorations, Canadian Nobles will receive charges for per capita (\$30) and hospital (US \$5) that also reflect the US/Canadian exchange rate in Canadian Dollars.

Temple fees will result in a total of \$143.90 for a Regular Member.

Pre-authorized Payment Plan PAPP members will see an increase on their final two payments to reflect this dues structure increase. For example, the September 29th withdrawal for members with Regular status will be \$38.20 and December 21st withdrawal will be \$38.20. Other members with PCM and PCM/PCLM will be applied accordingly. Please see the detailed chart below.

HOSPITAL REPORT

As of May 31, we had 102 patients, 82 Active and 20 inactive.

We now have one new Shrine Kid making our total 103. The new Shrine Kid is A. O., a nine year old female with Prader - Willi syndrome. She has had one visit in our Philadelphia Hospital in June and had another booked for August.

Since our last report ending on May 31, we have booked 11 flights for 8 children. Eight of these flights were to Montreal, using 24 vouchers with a total cost of \$7,565.94.

CURRENT PATIENT FILES 103

ACTIVE PATIENT FILES 82
INACTIVE FILES 20

Three flights were booked to the USA: 2 to Philadelphia and 1 to Cincinnati and these flights cost \$6,779.64 billed on VISA.

To date we have used 92 of 148 vouchers allotted, with a numerical value of \$28,071.74. We have also billed a total of \$16,854.73 on VISA for flights to the USA. Our theoretical total flight costs to this date to the PTF therefore counting numerical voucher values and credit card billings are \$44,926.47.

Finally the Saskatoon Club will be contacting approximately 20 Shrine Kids' families from the Saskatoon area as our guests to the Special Kid's Day at the Exhibition August 10, where

they received wrist bands for free rides, and were provided hot dogs, hamburgers and drinks.






