MESSAGE FROM CARTER BROWN



CARTER BROWN

I was so happy and honoured to be asked to speak here tonight for Illustrious Sir Brad and Lady Leeann's big night. They are such awesome people and I know they're going to have a great year and do really good

things for Shriners, our hospitals and Shrine kids!

For anyone that doesn't know me, I'm Carter Brown. I'm now 12 years old and still live in Milestone with my mom and dad, brother Finn and our dog, Sebastian. I've lived my life with Osteogenesis Imperfecta for as long as I can remember. I've always had to be extra careful because OI causes my bones to break easily. I've had around 20 fractures in my life, but that really would have been so many more if it wasn't for the incredible treatment I've always received at the Shriners Hospital in Montreal.

I've been there over 50 times and still continue to receive the bone building IV treatment I started getting when I was 7 weeks old. It's increased my bone density so it's within normal range and has helped reduce the number of breaks I was sure to have.



A couple years ago, I had my first big fractures since I was a baby. Even though my bones break easier, it still hurts just as much as anyone else. I have friends with OI who still break really often

and I decided I wanted to do something to try and help all of those other kids.

Many OI families have some sort of splinting kit they carry with them so they can splint their child wherever and whenever they fracture. The trouble is that we don't always have access to the really good lightweight splinting materials that OI kids need.

Our family decided to create a whole splinting kit to give to as many OI families as we could. We told some of the staff at the hospital in Montreal about our idea and they loved it! Not only would they help us get some of the best splints to use, they thought it would be amazing if every single OI family that goes to the hospital in Montreal could take one home with them. It turned into a really huge project really fast and pretty soon, I was fundraising to try and raise enough money to make 350 splint kits.

It was important to help people understand why this project mattered so much and how it would help these kids and their families. It hurts so much when you break a bone and moving it at all makes it even worse. The ride to the Emergency Room and the sitting and waiting and waiting before you even get seen is terrible. And then sometimes you don't even get splinted or casted at all or it's the wrong kind of cast for our bones. Your local doctor may not know anything about OI and they may not even be able to see the fracture in an OI patient's x-ray so they send us home. That's exactly what happened to my little friend Easton here in Regina. My mom took her splinting supplies that we kept at our house and helped his mom put a splint on his very



painful femur fracture. As soon as he was immobilized they could see he felt better immediately. If only that could've happened right after he fractured and not a couple days later, it would have been so much better. He was sent home from the hospital with nothing. It's just not right. But we can't just go to the store and buy those kinds of things. They're so easy to use and it can help our pain much sooner. It can even help families who want to travel or live far away from a hospital. There are many patients in Montreal that come from all over the world that really don't have access to any of this where they live so they are especially grateful. OI kids usually know when we've broken even before an x-ray shows it. Once the splint is on, it feels so much better. It's so much nicer to be treated quickly by your mom or dad and get on with your day.

One of the ways we raised money was being chosen by the Shriners Hospital in Montreal to be the focus of their Giving Tuesday campaign in November of 2017. My friend, Anthony Calvillo and I made videos together and all of the money raised that day went to the splint kits. I also sold cans of maple syrup and asked for donations for my birthday instead of gifts. People were very generous and we were able to create all 350 kits for every single OI patient that goes to the hospital. There was even a little bit left over so that families can go to our website and ask for replacement supplies at no charge when they have used up something in their kit.

Not only were we able to put splints, wraps, and scissors in the kits, there are demonstration videos and instructional cards on how to use it all. The hospital even made a bone matching game to put in there too.

The response from all of the families has been pretty amazing and they are so thankful. One mom said it was better than Christmas to get their kit! We've had interest and requests from all over the world. One family even sponsored an extra 4 kits to get sent to Nigeria to kids who haven't been able to come to Canada yet.

I know that the Shriners Hospital really changed my life. I was never supposed to walk and look at me now. I was supposed to be living a life of constant pain and breaking my arm from picking up a pencil, but my story changed as soon as you sent me to Montreal. The work you do is so important and really does make a difference. Any child that gets a chance to get treated by the experts in Montreal is so lucky and you are the ones that make that happen.

Thanks for watching me grow up for the last 12 years. I've learned a lot from watching you too. Giving back to others and trying to make someone's life a little better without asking for anything in return. Kindness is what's really important. I'm so thankful for all you've ever done for me and all of the Shrine kids who have a better life now because of you.

HOSPITAL REPORT

This report covers the period from Jan 19th 9AGM) to Feb 7th. It has been an exceedingly busy start to the year. Our patient numbers remain the same (94 Active and 31 Inactive) for a total of 125 Shrine Kids. However, we now have 10 applications submitted and waiting for approval and visit dates. Of these 10, 5 were new applicants in the past 3 weeks. One application as to Philadelphia and 4 to Montreal.

The first applicant was a 13 month old boy from Moose Jaw with infantile scoliosis. The second was an 18 year old boy from Stoughton who suffered a brachial plexus injury from a dirt bike accident last October, which left him with an almost complete paralysis of his left arm. His application was to the Philadelphia Shriners Hospitals for Children. The third applicant was a 4 year old boy from Waldheim who has almost complete deafness of his right ear. This child was referred to our Montreal hospital for a cochlear implant surgery. The final two applicants were a brother aged 9 and sister aged 11 from Saskatoon. The boy has cerebral palsy and his sister has scoliosis.

This year we have booked 14 flights, 13 in January and 1 in February. Of the 14, 11 were to Montreal, 2 to Cincinnati, and 1 to Boston.

Payment for 4 flights (2 to Montreal and 2 to Cincinnati) were from the Patient Transportation

Fund (PTF) with a total cost of \$5,127.

However, 10 flights were paid using corporate vouchers, with a total "equivalent" value of \$20,828.88, and we only have 82 vouchers left for the rest of the year. Because of this very large number of vouchers used so early, I plan on using the remaining 82 cautiously, by only using the vouchers for flights costing greater than an arbitrary \$1,500 a flight.

(REMEMBER EACH RETURN FLIGHT FOR A CHILD GREATER THAN 2 YEARS OLD WITH AN ACCOMPANYING PARENT USES 4 VOUCHERS). It is my hope that this will save approximately \$5,000 from the PTF this year.

Finally, this years Annual General Meeting had 3 families as our guests; the Browns, Van Roons and the Traffords. Carter Brown's speech was quite outstanding for a twelve year old. Hopefully, in the future we can have a number of our Shrine Kids and their families at each of our large gatherings. It is excellent to have this interaction between ourselves and our Shrine Kid's families.

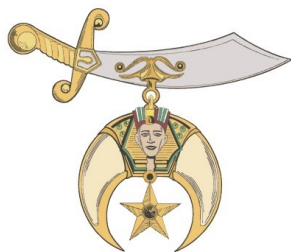

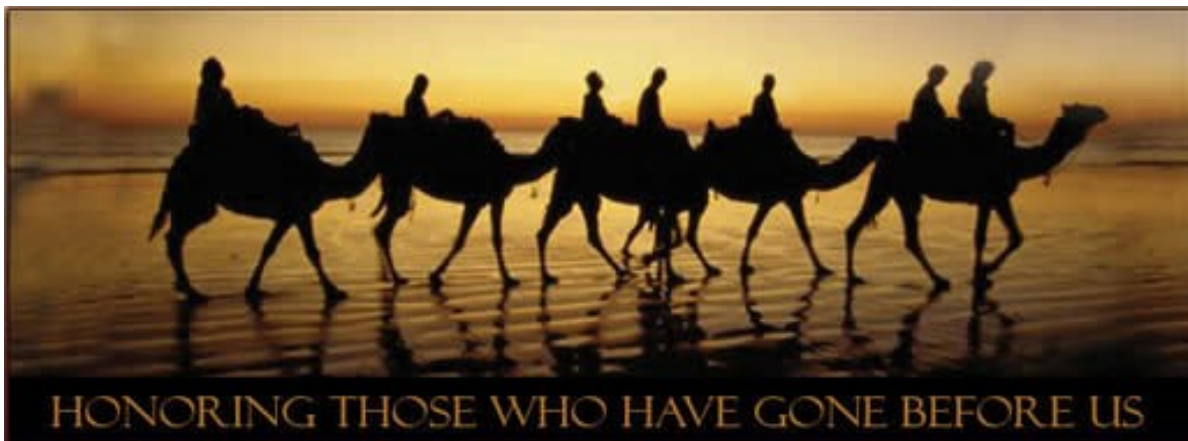

WA WA SHRINERS LADIES OF SASKATCHEWAN

GOING BACK TO THEIR ROOTS

When the WA WA Ladies Auxiliary was formed on May 6th 1925 in Regina the object was "to help furnish bedding and clothing for patients under treatment." By 1926, 162 articles of clothing plus \$2025 was donated to the Winnipeg Hospital from 6 Shrine Auxiliaries. These donations included surgeon's gowns, night gowns, stockings, sweaters, scarfs, bibs, and wash cloths. In the next 50 years WA WA Shriners Ladies donated thousands of articles of sewing and \$100,000 for specialty items for the hospital.

In 2018 Idella Barr, lady of Bill Fitzsimmons visited the Montreal Shrine Hospital and asked what they needed in addition to money. The answer was hospital gowns that are made to allow the patients to get in and out with tubes and I. V. after their surgery. Plus cloth diapers, bibs, lap quilts, afghans, white pillow cases and pillows in all shapes and sizes with removable covers.

Lady Synde Flaten, Lady Leeann Minogue and the upcoming Potentates Ladies immediately became inspired by this project and over the next 3 years will be asking the WA WA Shriners Ladies all over the province to assist in this sewing project. This project will take the WA WA Ladies back to its roots.

Lady Mary Ann Couse from Regina, a talented seamstress has developed patterns, instruction sheets and researched the correct material required, with input from Montreal. She presented the project to the Regina Ladies Auxiliary and received complete support. They approved funding

to purchase the material and supplies to make the hospital gowns.

Last November 10 ladies gathered for a cutting session at the WA WA Shriners Centre, they were able to cut out, serge and prepare enough supplies to make 46 hospital gowns for our patients. These are currently being sewn amongst the ladies who can sew. A second evening is scheduled for March or April this year to cut another 40 plus gowns in a larger size. Labels and iron on transfers are being attached to all the items which clearly state "Donated by WA WA Shriners Ladies", so that our patients are aware of their origin.

The other clubs within our Province have been asked to make cotton diapers and bibs for our patients, along with donations of lap quilts and afghans, white pillow cases, knitted dolls and teddy bears. Moosomin, Swift Current and Prince Albert Shrine ladies have already met or have plans for sewing parties. Patterns for the diapers and bibs have been handed out to the clubs around the Province and at recent AGM and are also available upon request.

Another way to contribute to the quality of life for the patients is to buy Gift cards from Walmart and the Dollar Store to be used by the hospital staff to pick up art supplies, school supplies, birthday celebration supplies and other celebrations. Sending cards is more cost effective than boxes of actual supplies.

We are still working out ways of transporting the items to the hospital, hopefully twice yearly. This

is currently being addressed by members and our 2019 Divan. There is no set goal for this year or the upcoming years but all donations will always make a difference in the lives of our patients. Other than the hospital gowns and gift cards all other items received are given to our patients as their own personal items.

A big thank-you to all the Shrine Clubs in WA WA for their continued support in this wonderful project.

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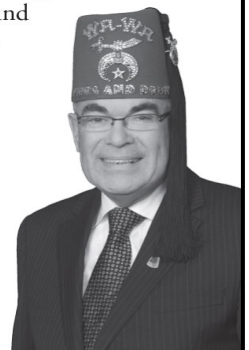
