I can't emphasis how much information is becoming available at www.wawashriners.org. I encourage all members to visit the website for regular updates in 'Shriners News—WA WA News'.

At the Divan level we are now using a video conferencing program called ZOOM to hold our Divan and DMT meetings. It works very well (we still have to get the "etiquette" right). Invited members can log in to the meeting from the comfort of their home or office (one member actually used his hands-free option in his vehicle

Wayne Miner P.P. who took over, booking flights

and looking after patient needs, until I was able to meet with him in late July. At that time, ILL Sir Wayne Miner P.P. and I met in Regina so that he could hand over files and bring me up to date on what he had done. ILL Sir Wayne Miner P.P. booked a number of

flights using West Jet vouchers during June, July and the beginning of August. Although I'm still trying to get exact numbers, I believe that, as of the end of July, we had used 120 out of the 142 donated vouchers, with another 16 being used during the first half of August. I am in the process of getting set up to be able to use some of the Aeroplan miles that have been donated by Air Canada, and so I hope to be able to use those to book some of the most expensive flights.

In July, I booked one round trip to Montreal for a patient and her mom using the PTF at the cost of

\$1468.18. However, that appointment has since been cancelled and that patient will not be going to the hospital until November. The flights can be cancelled but will cost us about \$400 to do so.

We also had a patient and parent cancel flights due to illness. Those flights had been paid for with vouchers. It seems that we will just lose those vouchers but that matter is still being checked.

In July, I received word that one young girl who had been referred in the spring had been accepted as a patient in Montreal and is awaiting her first appointment. I also sent a new patient form to one

> young boy in Norquay. The family will fill it out and send it directly to the hospital in Montreal.

In the near future I will be joining a conference call with Emmanuelle Rondeau and one or two of the other staff in Montre-

al, as well as Don Thomson from Winnipeg. They will attempt to bring me up to speed on all aspects of patient referral, transportation, and taking care of patient needs. I look forward to what I anticipate will be a challenging, yet rewarding, experience as Hospital Chairman.

As a parent of a shriner hospital patient I can't thank y'all enough. I know the many many hours sacrifice y'all make for children like mine. Thank the lord my Zoe is just missing part of her arm, there are many worse cases out there. I know the dedication you all put in, standing at store fronts, on corners, at events, plus most of you still have full time jobs and families of your own. I know that going to all these events costs money, every single time. I know that y'all participate and buy tickets also, not just 50/50 but jackpots, auctions. I know that you still take the time to send a child you have never met before a trading pin, a stuffed animal, a card with a gift card so she can get her tradition donut on Sunday mornings before church.

Want to know what I see when I see y'all selling tickets, or at functions, or collecting money, or sweating off 3 layers of sweat at a circus in a tent selling hot food or under a ton of clown makeup? I see a hero. I see an incredible role model, I see a dad, uncle, grandpa teaching their families what it means to be selfless.

Zoe is so proud to tell everyone she meets about being a shriner kid and about her shriner friends.

I can never thank you enough or repay your kindness.







The two brothers were talking and one asked Frank S Land whether he could talk to the young boy. Dad Land called Louis J. Lower to come to his office in the Scottish Rite office. "Louis" asked Dad Land, "who do you hanging around with?", Louis answered that he said that he had some friends in his neighbourhood. Dad Land asked him if he would like to form a club and meet here at the Temple?. Louis liked the idea and showed up the next week with eight of his friends. Thus DeMolay has been enriching the lives of young men by providing a funfilled platform that unconsciously develops key life

skills such as public speaking , fundraising, and event planning. At the first meeting there were nine young men and Dad Land. They were Louis Lower, Ralph Sewell, Elmer Dorsey, Edmund Marshall, Jerome Jacobson

William Steinhilber,

Ivan Bentley, Gorman McBride, and Clyde Strearm, and Dad Land. The boys were throwing around possible names for their club when Louis asked Dad Land could he tell us about some leaders from the past. Dad Land told them the story about Jacques DeMolay and his faith in his crusaders and his death at the stake in France at the hands of the King at the

time. Thus began the rise of a youth organization that on March 18th of 2019 DeMolay celebrated 100 years.

An interesting note and tie to Dad Land is that when he was serving as Imperial Potentate he and his officers came to Regina in 1952 to dedicate WA WA Temple. At this time there is no DeMolay Chapter in the province but your Grand Lodge Officers are working on establishing Chapters in Saskatoon and Regina.

SASKATOON SHRINE CLUB

100 years ago the Saskatoon Shrine Club held it's first meeting on January 10, 1919 at the end of the Great War. This past June they celebrated their 100th year of continuous service in the City of Saskatoon.

During the past 100 years, the club has had four homes. Their original home was in the Masonic temple on 4th Ave and 21st street, moving above the Bank of Nova Scotia (1931 -60), into the basement of the Glengarry Building at 245 3rd Ave South, then during the 1970's residing above Wayne's Furnishing and interiors in the 200 block of 3rd Ave South and are now housed in their current home (1984) in the lower level of the New Masonic Temple at 1021 Saskatchewan Crescent West.

The club is currently home to a number of units including: Classic Cars, Clown Unit, Drums and Bugles Band, Indy Car Unit, Muckletonians, Motor Patrol and the Arab Unit.

To mark this distinguished milestone, the Saskatoon Shrine Club hosted two 100th activities in June. This included the rededication of the newly renovated Saskatoon Shrine Club on Friday June 14th which was expanded this past January and February to accommodate events for up to 240 people.

The rededication included representation, comments from and a Ribbon cutting by WA WA Potentate Illustrious Sir Brad Barlow, MLA for Saskatoon/University Honourable Eric Olauson,

Deputy Mayor of Saskatoon, Councillor Zack

Jefferies and Saskatoon Shrine Club President Noble Craig Inkster.
