
"Challenge" for 2020 in the title represents the impact COVID-19 has made on the fraternity, an introspect by III Sir Bob Keep.

All the plans and work that was scheduled at the beginning of this year was all for naught as this pandemic hit hard. Thankfully, we were able to hold one of the most successful events bringing Masons and Shriners together in one place, "The Shrine Mason Gala 2020", and this was way back in February, a few weeks before the lock-down. I know the next Shrine Mason Gala will be bigger and better. It was to be an annual or semiannual event. I would like to acknowledge and thank my ambassadors from both Saskatoon and Regina for their tireless efforts when called upon to assist in my endeavors. Thank you to Ron Stankov and his team of Pote's volunteers.

We had planned some major fundraisers such as the

Shrinerama with the Saskatchewan Rush that may have resulted in some serious fundraising dollars. We had booked 2 shows with the RCMP Musical Ride that would have brought in countless dollars. We were working hard to launch a TV Bingo and a 50/50 draw and had hoped to have both fundraisers ready to go in the early stages of the lockdown only to be locked out again.

We had planned many improvements such as holding Stated Sessions at various Clubs throughout the province and having representatives from the Club executives to announce their activities throughout the year. We were simply trying to build a much closer tie with our Nobles, Clubs, Executives, and Divan. On the plus side Clubs were able to attend the last stated session by Zoom and 6 Clubs joined the meeting.

Our Midwest Shrine Association (MSA) Summer

Session scheduled for Regina in August was canceled and we missed the opportunity to come together with Nobles from the 15 other temples in the MSA and show off the Shrine, who we are, and what we do for the citizens of Regina and Saskatchewan. Our Provincial Golf Tournament that the committee spent hours working on making it a family affair and was destined to be the largest gathering at a golf event we have ever had was also canceled.

Since he Shrine Mason Gala, we have been largely locked down relying on technology for virtual communication and meetings.

When we canceled MSA way back in April, we certainly made the right decision, and although a potentially great money maker, we saved many dollars that were already spent on deposits and other amenities. All our deposits were returned without incident. We made cost-cutting decisions that had to be made by lowering our office expenses and personal accounts. Our income for rentals ceased and the building was vacant. Fixed costs for the building still had to be paid and any necessary repairs had to be made. We did take advantage of the lack of rentals to make a few improvements to the upper hall to enhance its appeal to renters when we can once again be back in business. Primarily these involved painting the stage and bar areas with volunteer labor so our only cost was the paint and other supplies.

Fundraising has been at a virtual standstill, except for a few Shrine Clubs that have carried on struggling to complete their projects. Some of our clubs were still able to fundraise despite the pandemic but for most clubs, their traditional projects had to be canceled or postponed. Shrine Clubs continued to have expenses such as rent, utilities, and maintenance. Others completely shut down.

A few clubs worked extremely hard during the Pandemic and learned how to run a successful project during challenging times. By using social media and leveraging personal contacts, these Clubs were able to generate excitement among the general public, and above all continued to create Shrine awareness. The lessons they learned may prove beneficial to all projects in the future and share their successes with all the clubs as it may be possible to duplicate them in other locations.

TV Bingo finally becomes Reality!!!



It is official. SLGA has approved the WA WA Shriners application to produce a weekly bingo from the Access Communications studio every Saturday at 4:00 pm. After over two years of effort and design the first Saskatchewan on-line media bingo will be posted to a dedicated WA WA Shriners website. The video, rules of play, list of card vendors, prize board, and winners will be available on the website for Saskatchewan residents to play and enjoy.

Many Shriners were responsible for the final product. The effort to obtain approval was supported by the Divan for several years and with the expertise provided by Access Communications Co-operative, we were able to convince the SLGA that an on-line media bingo was secure and a viable game of chance that WA WA could deliver. We still have some logistics to conclude but we are a go with our first game available to

play on February 6th.

These reports were reviewed by our financial people to ascertain if there were any shrine clubs in financial difficulty. We recognize that our shrine clubs are critical to the future of WA WA SHRINERS. It is important that when business and life return to some sort of normality that our Clubs can pick up and carry on with our mission to help our Shriners Hospitals for Children. It is also important that WA WA Shriners remain financially strong to survive the pandemic as well.

WA WA Shriners finances are in good shape and we now have a package to assist the local Shrine Clubs of WA WA Shriners. This package is to support and recognize our Clubs, for all the years of service, loyalty, support, and input they have given to make WA WA what it is today. The **WA WA Shriners Club Relief Fund** is a first recorded since 1911.

A motion was made and unanimously approved at a Stated Session that WA WA Shriners provide the following assistance to the Shrine Clubs for the calendar year 2020:

The 2020 annual assessment by WA WA Shriners to each club be waived, and

The clubs be permitted to keep all proceeds from 2020 fundraising projects, and

Each club will receive a grant of \$40 per member in good standing.

Nobles, the steps we have taken now will help ensure our Clubs are ready and able to thrive once the pandemic is over.

































MEMBERSHIP—A BITTER REALITY

As I leave the office of Potentate, my Shrine career thus far has been devoted to Membership. I have been sending out and promoting what seems to be a similar message for the past 6 years with the impetus on recruiting new candidates for our fraternity and philanthropy. With all the resources we have for training and developing, it appears our messages fall on deaf ears or simply a case of each member thinking someone else will do it. Our numbers continue to decline each year and it is too alarming to say the least. Some of our Clubs haven't had a new candidate in years.

Membership is the #1 priority and is the responsibility of every member to assist in its development. (If each member keyed in on a relative, friend, acquaintance and solicited 1 individual for next year, our troubles are behind us.

Our numbers are dwindling throughout the Province and the Shrine as a whole, and it is time to take crucial action and solicit new members. Our Goal is to work harder to get more members in order to keep WA WA healthy and in a position to maintain a high level of support for our children going to our hospitals.

This year began with plans of instituting Shriners International 4 R's, Retention, Recruitment, Restoration, Relationships, and by dividing the four areas into individual tasks for the elected Divan.

The March Ceremonial Plans in Saskatoon had to be cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic which has forever changed society. We had approximately twelve candidates planning to join WA WA at that time and all had to be postponed until we could safely schedule another Ceremonial.

We could not just sit in limbo and wait for all of this pandemic and physical distancing to end. Now, more than ever, we needed to keep in touch with our Nobility. The Divan was asked to reach out to the Nobility.

We need to know just how much of an impact that COVID-19 could have to our Temple once the air

clears. Many of our Nobles have been laid off or are unemployed and many will likely be struggling to pay Lodge Dues and Shrine Dues so we are going to have to be very creative in our planning on how we plan to address this. Simply suspending members during difficult times over which they have no control, is likely not the responsible position we should be taking.



Our mission this past year was to increase membership by the 5 - 2 - 2 plan.

We needed to focus on the relationships with existing, past and potential members, families, friends as well as the entire Masonic family.

Our goal within WA WA is to support our nobles, clubs and units to strive for:

5% or greater increase in the creation of new nobles

2% or greater increase in restoration of former nobles

2% or less decrease in the suspension of existing nobles

We had 663 Nobles as of October 31st.

5% is 33 new Nobles created in 2020

2% is 13 Nobles restored from suspensions or demit in 2020

2% is 13 Nobles or less decrease in suspension of current Nobles

At the start of 2020, we had 691 Nobles and are down 18 Nobles in the first quarter. The majority of those are suspensions. We are now down to 663 at the end of the 3rd quarter. Please, let's stop the bleeding!!!!


The Membership Committee developed the New Noble Passport for the 2020 year. The purpose of this passport is to introduce a new Shriner into the philanthropy with some key information but also to get them actively involved. Each new Noble will have the opportunity to get a full reimbursement of their annual dues if they collect more than 50 points out a possible 75 points. The point system is set-up to ensure we have participation in parades, meetings and club events but in order to actually get the 50 points, they would need to be a first line signer for a new candidate(s). Membership is also about marketing and having new Shriners definitely benefits the philanthropy, having active Shriners helps market the Fez in the community.

The Thought of Membership:

When the subject of membership is raised in our Temple, have you ever (mentally or actually) just rolled your eyes and said, that all the Membership Chairman and Divan ever talk about!! Be honest.

So, why do we "always" bring up the importance of increasing our membership numbers? Why do we say it is the responsibility of every noble to work on this?

The obvious answers would be that the Temple needs sufficient funds to operate effectively; that we can support one of the most amazing and generous philanthropies in the world, and, as part-owners, we need to do our part financially, as well as volunteering. More members mean we are more financially sound



and stable. The responsibility for recruitment, retention and restoration belongs to all nobles.

Those are valid reasons, but they are secondary ones.

We want to encourage good men to join us because, as Shriners, they will have unique opportunities to experience what it means to be part of a selfless, compassionate brotherhood; to improve the world and their home communities; to make incredible differences in the lives of children; and to have fun. Shriners are known and loved worldwide because of what they believe in and stand for, and for their actions on behalf of their fraternal family, and others.

Every one of us shares in the amazing accomplishments of the patients of Shriners Hospitals for Children. From first steps to first words spoken clearly, and in joys and sorrows of our fraternal brothers. Each one of us truly is part of a worldwide caring family.

We stress membership because we want to share this life with as many good men as possible. And, as I have said for 6 long years, every one of us can help make that happen.

We all must continue to identify potential members, and work with them to achieve our goals. As valuable to membership growth as the BeAFreemason.org and beashrinernow.com websites have the potential to become, individual Shriners will continue to have the most impact.

Remember, if each of our nobility brings in just one new member, through recruitment or restoration, the fraternity's overall membership will double. If each member brings in two, it will triple. It's time to reenergize our individual membership efforts, remembering that the strength of our fraternity affects the strength of our philanthropy.

Throughout my Membership reign and involved in the collection of dues, I have heard Nobles say they are not active in the Shrine for many reasons and that they are considering a demit. It has been said many times that you only get out of the Shrine what you put in. I believe we all need to be reminded from time to time why we joined the Worlds greatest Philanthropy and that:

"As Shriners, we look beyond ourselves to serve the needs of others, especially children who cannot help themselves. We believe Shriners Hospitals to be the world's greatest philanthropy and we covenant with each other to support its temples of mercy with SPIRIT, TIME, TALENT AND MEANS."

If one does not have the time, it is important to note that some of your membership dues do go to help Children in our Shrine Hospitals. Please give it some thought before considering a demit, because eventually you will have more time to give.

RYAN'S STORY A SHRINERS HOSPITALS FOR CHILDREN PATIENT

to many in this country. He survived a horrific bus crash that killed 16 of his friends two and a half years ago now. It was April 2018 when the driver of a semi-trailer truck blew through a stop sign and into the path of a bus carrying the <u>Humboldt Broncos</u> junior hockey team at an intersection 30 kilometers north of Tisdale, Sask. . Ryan suffered a severe spinal injury that left him paralyzed from the chest down. He also had broken ribs, a broken collarbone, a punctured lung, and bleeding in his head and pelvis area. Despite this terrible and life-changing tragedy, Ryan showed incredible mental fortitude in the weeks and

months that followed.

Shortly after the accident, PP III Sir Bob Newman from Al Azhar temple in Calgary initiated a conversation and call to Ryan's Mom and Dad, Michelle, and Tom Straschnitzki about whether or not they would be receptive to having Ryan attending Shriners Hospitals for Children in Philadelphia P.A. that specialize and focus on acute chronic spinal cord injuries. In Philadelphia, Ryan received at least three hours a day of therapy that focused on restoring as much function as possible and working on everyday skills such as dressing, learning how to transition from a bed to a wheelchair, and how to navigate in a wheelchair. The treatment was very successful and the staff said he was a model patient and they had nothing but great accolades for the way he was dedicated to and pursued the treatments.

When the Shrine Mason Gala 2020 became a reality, Ill Sir Bob Keep approached Ill Sir Ernie Hilland, PP of Al Azhar to make contact with the family to ascertain if Ryan would be receptive to attend the Gala as a keynote guest speaker. Ryan had hoped to attend the Gala in person but was unable to as he was invited to participate in the Canadian National sledge hockey team tryouts that same weekend. After many phone

calls with Ryan's dad Tom, and as a result, Ryan agreed and helped prepare a live video with the assistance of III. Sirs Bob Keep, Ernie Hilland, and Bob Newman. The video was produced at the Straschnitzki home in Airdrie, Alberta shortly before the Gala. In the video, Ryan spoke of his experiences at the Shriners Hospitals for Children in Philadelphia and how the staff and doctors were amazing after being there over a month, he made many great friends and above all had a fun

time with the treatments being successful. Ryans Dad Tom commented that the Philadelphia Shriners staff was fantastic as they put up with them doing wheelchair races in the hallways at 1:00 A.M. The staff loved the family and always perplexed, commented, " What are those Canadians doing now".

The one thing Ryan could take away with him from the Hospital was that there is always new technology coming out and with the vast knowledge of the Doctors, he is to not give up on the hope of someday walking again. What they showed and taught him at the hospital was incredible and knowing that living in a

wheelchair isn't the end of the road and that he is still able to do things that he didn't think he would ever manage.

His Mom, Michelle, said she couldn't thank the Shriners enough in Philadelphia and Calgary and that they have all been a Godsend to. Ryan is doing much better and well into his hockey program now. Ryan said that it felt great to be back on the ice again. Sledge hockey is a different sport as you use your arms as your legs and it is much harder than hockey but he is learning it stride by stride. He thinks it's important to become a Shriner helping kids and people like him and advocates for disabilities and making a change in the lives of children. The message he would like to give out to young people going through something similar or other disabilities is to keep pushing forward. Through a positive mentality and hard work, anything can be accomplished. It's never going to be the end of the road as one door closes another door opens

and its never the end of the tunnel and for him. After the accident, his first reaction was, what will he do next? With the support of people around him, his family, and friends including what he learned at the Shriners Hospitals for Children, he started to realize it's not the end of the road. With hard work and physio, he has come along way. Anything is possible as he looks forward to the future knowing that anything can happen.

Ryan and his parents expressed their gratitude to




all the Shriners involved in helping them on their journey. It was a very moving and heartfelt video.

Since Ryan's story aired at the Shrine Mason Gala in February of 2020, he spends six hours a week in physiotherapy and up to four days a week on the ice. His determination seemed unshakable, but Straz said something changed when the pandemic started to sweep across the world last March, and he was forced to finally just sit with it all. His life changed again dramatically. The lockdown from the unprecedented Covid-19 has forced him to address his mental and emotional well -being after


everything else shutdown. He is speaking out about how therapeutic it has been to talk to others about what's going on inside. He says the pandemic has led to 'darkest days' since the bus crash. "I had a lot of time to think and I ended up not feeling too good," he said. "I didn't know what to do and I started talking to people, and realized this is probably the way to go — to keep talking and journaling. "And every time I did that, each day got better and better." Now Ryan spends a couple of days a week learning to walk with the help of a machine and trying to build up his legs. Ryan's efforts to improve his leg muscle mass and bone density, as well as his balance, are paying off.



Ryan's Mom, Michelle, said the Shriners Hospitals for Children In Philadelphia and the Shriners of Calgary were a Godsend. She couldn't thank them enough for their unwavering support and generosity in the rehabilation and time spent with Ryan.

We wish Ryan all the best in his future endeavors and continuing recovery. We thank his family for the time and effort they afforded us upon our visit. Ryan and Tom both expressed their desire to travel to Saskatchewan for a future Shrine event. They were scheduled to appear at the MSA summer session Regina, but that was canceled. We hope to see them at the MSA summer session in 2025 in Regina to share their stories and experiences.



HOSPITAL REPORT



2020 has certainly been a different year for all of us, and I know it has affected our patients and the staffs at our Shrine hospitals in a very significant way. We have not had any patients travelling to any of the US hospi-

tals since March, and only 5 that have travelled to Montreal. The majority of those patients have gone because of a necessary surgery. The doctors have done a lot of teleconferences, especially with out-of-province patients.

We had a number of appointments cancelled in the spring, and some for which flights had already been booked. Some flights had been paid by credit card. We were reimbursed for some of those flights, and received a credit for others. If the flights were using Aeroplan miles, those miles were reinstated and the money paid was refunded. On flights booked with West Jet vouchers, the vouchers could be credited to us if there was enough time between the cancellation and the flight. However, we are sitting at the end of the year now with about 100 unused vouchers, and have not been told yet whether we can carry those over to 2021 or if we will lose them.

I sat in on a conference call with the people from Shriners Hospital for Children, Canada on December 2. They are very happy with the way everything has been handled since the outbreak of the pandemic, and haven't had any Covid 19 cases within the hospital. They are now seeing as many patients as they were pre-pandemic. There were many thank you messages to the temples for the continued support, as well as to the many ladies across the country who helped with sewing projects.

Recently, you should have received emails promoting the "Because of You, I Can" Campaign. There is a hope that there will be \$200,000 raised in this virtual fundraiser, which will run until just after Christmas. There has been an anonymous donor who has agreed to match donations up to a maximum of \$50,000. Information on how to donate can be found on the hospital web page (https://www.shrinershospitalsforchildren.org/montreal) or on the hospital Facebook page. Any donors who send \$50.00 or more will receive a Fezzy Christmas ornament.

As of December 2, there were still some of the Shriners masks available, although it sounds like sales have been brisk, with Saskatchewan and Newfoundland leading the way. Congratulations WA WA! They're great fitting masks, and only \$10.00 each.

SASKATOON SHRINE CLUB

Illustrious Sir Bob was kind enough to phone me today to see how Lady Heather and I are doing. In case you missed it we were among the 237 Canadians aboard Grand Princess and had been enjoying a wonderful 15 day cruise from San Francisco to the four main Hawaiian islands. On day 12 of our cruise, Wednesday, March 4, we were informed that a passenger who had gotten off the previous cruise to Mexico on our ship had contracted COVID 19 (that person died that day which shows this virus is no joke). We were soon told that a planned stop in Ensenada Mexico would not take place and that we would be proceeding directly to San Francisco. We were scheduled to disembark on March 7. On Thursday at about 1 p.m. we were told that we would be confined to our rooms for the duration of the cruise and that any future meals would be delivered by room service. (Sounds like fun, but the pickings were getting pretty slim by the end.) And the fun began. The next days were filled with a lot of noninformation from the Captain (beyond our control,

abundance of caution, and the ship was safe and secure were his catchphrases) with a lot of uncertainty about what our future held. In defence of Princess and the Captain, I truly believe the responsibility for the outbreak was not theirs. Medical personnel came aboard that day by helicopter and conducted testing for the virus on passengers and crew members with the result being 19 crew and 2 passengers testing positive. I was pretty sure that we weren't going anywhere fast.

As governments haggled and plans progressed we eventually learned that we would be docking in Oakland on Monday, March 9 and that Canadians would be transported on a plane chartered by the Canadian Government to CFB Trenton, Ontario for 14 days of quarantine. We were very thankful on Monday morning when we sailed under the Golden Gate Bridge into San Francisco Bay. We had several glimpses of the bridge starting on Saturday as we came closer to land to offload sick passengers and receive prescriptions that had been picked up on land. We would then head back out to sea (40 or 50 miles from the coast). It was quite amusing to look at the path of the ship displayed on the stateroom TV as it traced a large rectangle with many squiggles showing our trips to almost land which Heather likened to an Etch a Sketch drawing.

There was much cheering both by passengers and those on shore as we landed at the Port of Oakland. Until noon we were still unsure of our departure time as the Captain had said it could take

several days to disembark the ship. At 1215 we received a knock on the door and found our luggage tags taped to the door with a note saying we should be packed by 1200 and disembarkation would begin at 3 p.m. And away we go. We hope we didn't leave anything behind because they were going to destroy everything left on the ship.

After having our temperature taken and being declared cool as a cucumber and fit to travel, we boarded a freezing cold bus with a boxed lunch on the seat and sat at the port for 90 minutes waiting to form a convoy to the Oakland Airport. Upon arrival we were excited to see a Boeing 747 from Kalitta Air (which a quick Google search showed was a cargo airline and some clever passenger found was vintage 1974) so the excitement faded quickly as we entered the plane. It was a hollowed out jumbo jet with seats bolted to the floor and four toilets at the rear some of which had no running water or hand sanitizer (If the virus doesn't get you, some other germs might). There were no windows so when we started moving it was much like one of those virtual rides you see at theme parks. The turbulence about an hour into our flight wasn't virtual though.

Life on the base is slightly better than quarantine on the ship in that we're allowed to walk the yard for an hour at a time on four different occasions (two which occur at meal times which is kinda screwed up). The food is lacking in nutritional value for people who they are trying to keep healthy although we hear they've brought a nutritionist in



today so we're hoping for better things. There's no damned cable but the wifi is blazing fast so streaming is good. Only 12 more days in paradise then full parole.

We are both still healthy as I write this and are in much better position then some who arrived with either no warm clothing or no clothing at all (they'd sent their laundry out on the ship and it never returned). The Red Cross is supposed to supply everyone with necessities of all sorts and we're all anxiously awaiting arrival of these supplies.

So as not to be a total Debbie Downer I am sure this is a one of a kind experience. Princess has

been very generous in compensating us for our inconvenience and I am certain we will travel with them again. In fact it is my intention to plan a WA WA Shrine Cruise through my travel business sometime when the world has returned to whatever normal is in the future. Cruising is an enjoyable holiday and a great way to explore the world.

I leave you with a picture of Heather and me after we had renewed our wedding vows on Grand Princess, probably the best memory we will have of this trip.

Al and Heather never when anywhere after this except to settle down on Vancouver Island for the winter with no snow.







