

A MESSAGE FROM THE POTENTATE

Ladies and Nobles,

"Nobody grows old by merely living a number of years. People grow old by deserting their ideals. You are as young as your faith, as old as your doubts; as young as your self-confidence, as old as your fear; as young as your hope, as old as your despair." Douglas MacArthur.


WA WA SHRINE HOSPITAL REPORT – FEBRUARY, 2021

Visits to the Shriners Hospital for Children, Canada remain low. We had one patient come home in January after a surgery and rehab, and there will be one patient going to Montreal in February for surgery. There have been no patients travelling to any of the US hospitals.

We will continue to be able to use Air Canada's Aeroplan miles on some flights, and will also have some West Jet vouchers to use in 2021, although I haven't been given exact numbers yet.

I anticipate that the number of patients travelling to the hospital will remain low for the next while.




INDIAN HEAD SHRINE CLUB
