MEMBERSHIP at the beginning of 2022 was down to 636 (based on the January 31, 2022 report) from 773, five years prior.

drop in numbers wrong for WA WA as a whole, but it will have other consequences. We currently have three voting delegates at the Imperial Session. If we drop below 600 Nobles, we fall to two representatives. As the Shrine and our health care system (Shriners Children's) continue to evolve, we must retain our votes to have our say in the future. HOSPITAL REPORT



Hospital Report—February 2022

Everything has continued to go well at the hospital in Montreal. COVID protocols within the hospital remain firmly in place. This is even more important considering the effect of the 5th wave and the Omicron variant. All suppliers, students and visitors are required to have proof of double vaccination upon entering the building. The hospital continues to be COVID free.

The following table has some interesting facts from 2021:

As well, there were more than 500 telehealth encounters with physicians, rehab team members and nutritionists during 2021.

From January 1 to mid-February 2022, we have arranged flights for 8 different WA WA patients, all going to Montreal. With the exception of one flight that was booked on short notice after a surgery, we were able to use either WestJet vouchers or Aeroplan miles to help pay for the flights. I do always try to use the WestJet vouchers if possible, but that has remained a challenge with the reduced flights and the long layover times that are often involved. Because of that, the majority of flights have been with Air Canada.
