MIDWEST SHRINE ASSOCIATION 2022

I want to take this opportunity to define and explain the term you hear as MSA. The Midwest Shrine Association (MSA) was created to engender greater fellowship among the MSA Shrine Temples and their members and to secure a more significant recognition of Shriners International throughout the territories of this association.

Shriners International recognizes eleven regional Shrine Associations. These associations allow individual Shrine Temples to join together for fun, fellowship and camaraderie. It also will enable Shriners to share ideas on improving Shrinedom in their areas. At many Association conventions, Shrine Club units compete against one another for who is the best, band, clown, motorized unit, pipes & drums, foot patrol, horse unit and Chanter.

Today the MSA has sixteen Temples from the States of Iowa, Minnesota, North and South Dakota, Wisconsin and Michigan, and Temples from Manitoba and Saskatchewan. These Temples have a combined membership of approximately 14,000 Nobles.

The Midwest Shrine Association holds two primary functions each year. Each February, the winter session is a business meeting (a Stag Event) for executive officers, committee heads, and association units. The summer session and conference are open to all Shriners and their families, which includes various social events, all –Shriner parades, and Unit competitions. All MSA Shriners are invited to attend. A different Shrine Center hosts these meetings yearly, so it takes sixteen years to roll around to our Temple.

Illustrious Sir Darroch Cairns led a caravan of Nobles, Ladies and Children of WA WA Shriners to attend the annual MSA summer session in Green Bay, Wisconsin,

from August 17th - 20th. It took most to travel two days to and from the event.



The session kicked off with a Celebration of 150 years of Shrinedom. There were 421 Nobles, 237 Ladies and only 12 children registered for a total of 670 total participants. 293 Nobles, Ladies and kids





joined in for the welcoming dinner and Shrine Circus carnival. All had fun between the carnival and casino games—an actual shrine circus carnival event. Proceeds from our Wednesday night carnival were given to

WGA-4-Kids, our auxiliary at Shriners Children's - Twin Cities. At this event, Noble Jason Istead, his lady and children had an absolute blast at the festivities. The marketplace was open to all, where many masonic and shrine paraphernalia were displayed and offered for purchase. It replicates a Shrine mini mall !!!!

Thursday was a great day, including an MSA Golf Outing with 27 participants and an MSA Shooting competition with 36 participants. Trophies were handed out to our winners, but everyone won by having fun and fellowship together. Our Thursday night parade in Seymour and our Oasis serving over 700 people was a great success. Seymour embraced the Shriners and their ladies. There were organized motorcycle rides, a golf outing & pistol shoots, plus opportunities to visit Green Bay, including shopping at the Packers Pro Shop and touring the stadium. Thursday afternoon, a big All Shrine parade was produced for the spectators in Seymour, WI, followed by a tailgate party at County Fairgrounds. Our paraders representing WA WA Shriners included Ill Sir Darroch Cairns, Noble Malcolm Gutfriend, Noble Mike Scarfe and Noble Jason Istead marching. At the same time, Noble Stu Larson drove behind in the WA, WA

On Friday, there were clown competitions and motorized unit competitions. In the afternoon, there were many optional events to attend, including association awards luncheons, Past Potentates & Royal order of Jesters receptions and a well-attended Moonshine tasting put on by a Hillbilly unit. Friday was our customary Ladies Luncheon and was well attended by 169 ladies. Presentations included a brief history of the Oneida Nation, Darla Hansen, one of the first burn patients in our Galveston Hospital and Mandi Sturlaugson pre-

sending the Imperial First ladies' program on sports injury treatment. Monies from the lady's luncheon basket raffle went to our first ladies' program. Friday evening, Shrine-a-Rama, a big celebration, was held in honour of 100 years of Shrine Health Care for Children with pizza and several Birthday cakes to be enjoyed by all attendees. A great band, Big Mouth and the Power Tool Horns, entertained. The opening Football game at Lambeau Field was with the Green Bay Packers and the New Orleans Saints. Nobles Bob Keep and Noble Stu Larson and their ladies attended the game along with 65,000 screaming fans. The Packers won the game!!!

Saturday morning, the session concluded with another big parade and an Oasis at the Beja Shrine Temple, where we all had a grab-n-go box lunch for the trip home.

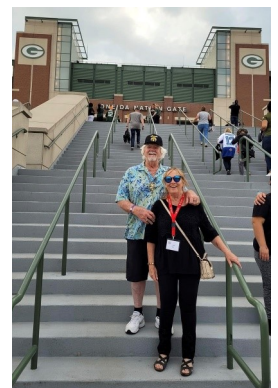
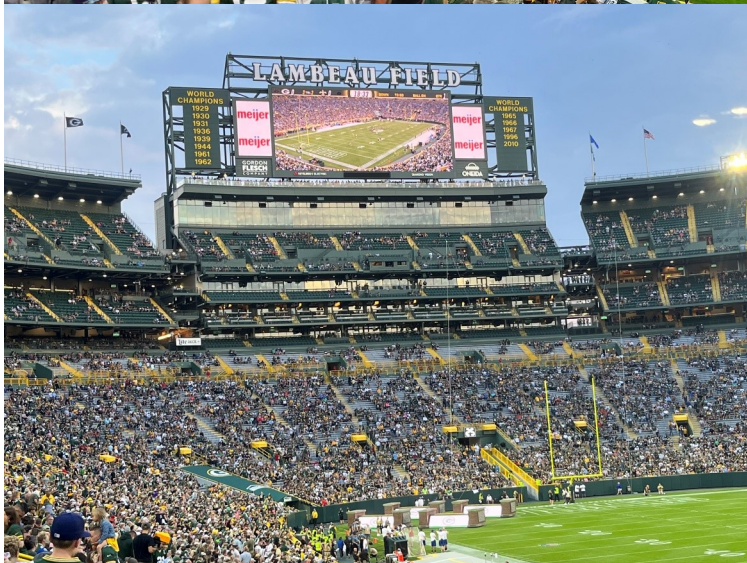

My FezCard Viewer

The My FezCard Viewer app gives you immediate access to your digital membership card on your smartphone without the need to carry a physical card in your wallet. Additional benefits of the My FezCard Viewer include a unique QR code function that allows you to check in for stated meetings at your temple, club or unit, earn award points, enter raffle drawings and more!

For Nobles that do not own a smartphone, the local Temple, Club, or Unit can scan the QR code on your existing gold-colored membership hard card to instantly determine membership status and check-in for stated meetings/events.

Prior to paying 2023 dues, the digital membership card on the My FezCard Viewer app will appear as the gold version.

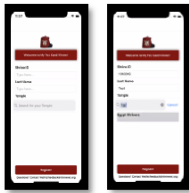

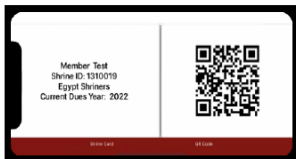

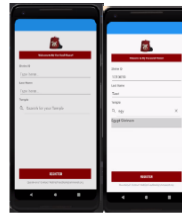

If each Noble focused on a relative, friend, or acquaintance and signed up one individual for the fall ceremonial and next year, our troubles would be behind us, and growth would happen again.

Let's be positive to have positive growth in 2023!

I want to take this opportunity and, with much gratification, thank all Nobles that paid their membership dues this year on time. All Nobles in arrears were contacted after the dues deadline, and each made a dedicated effort to clear up their overdue accounts as quickly as possible. Many Nobles had to be called several times, putting a strain on our office staff, but they graciously came through in the end. The Temple is so much better for it through all these tough times and financial strains, it helped out tremendously. As of May 31, 2022, I am pleased to report that WA WA has no Nobles in arrears with dues.

During the calls, some Nobles opted for the PAP (Pre Authorized Payment) plan that many Nobles have signed up for throughout the years. Time and money are saved for all parties as your dues are paid quarterly by direct payment, and you are always current with your dues. I suggest that you seriously consider this option to help yourself and the Temple.

Just a reminder, your dues are due on January 1, 2023 or before.

Pre Authorized Membership Dues Payment Plan

WA WA Shriners has implemented an Automatic Dues Payment Program for annual membership dues. This program is being recommended and adopted by more and more temples throughout North America, as a method to reduce administrative costs and thereby keep our membership dues as low as possible.

If you already are having any utility bills or other bill payments being done by direct withdrawal from your bank account, then you are already familiar with this concept. For those of you who are not familiar with this process, the basics are that a noble will grant permission for the Temple to withdraw quarterly payments throughout the year and subsequent years, directly from a nobles bank account in order to pay for annual WA WA membership or Permanent Contributing Member (PCM) dues as stipulated in the Temple bylaws.

Members may enroll at any time during the year. Payments would commence in the first possible quarter: March, June, September, December (on the last day of the work week and pre-Christmas) and the first payment would depend on the date enrolled. Breakdown below for a Regular member status (as per Temple Bylaw's) for pre-payment of 2023 Member dues at \$144.80.

However, during the 2017 Imperial Session, legislation was passed requiring all payment made to Shriners International be made in US Dollars. The exchange rate is selected on August 1st – the beginning of the newly established Shriners International fiscal year – and shall be valid until the following July 31st to ensure a consistent charge between dues notices. Pre-authorized Payment Plan (PAPP) members will see an increase/decrease on their final two payments to reflect this dues structure increase.*

Subsequent year's membership dues would be deducted on the last banking day of March, June, Sept, and Dec at an amount equal to one quarter of the annual dues for the upcoming calendar year as per Temple Bylaws.

All electronic information is retained ONLY on the Bank of Nova Scotia secure website – no electronic banking information is maintained on any WA WA computer. The signed authorization forms will be stored in a safety deposit box at the Bank of Nova Scotia.

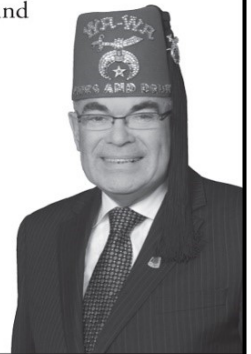
