



#### **MEMBERSHIP REPORT**

4R's

Nobles All – Membership strength is the key to the prolonged survival of our fraternity and Temple! Have we ever heard that slogan? Do we do anything about it? Over and Over, we fight for survival. We need every Noble in WA WA to help solicit new candidates for our

Temple. It sounds so simple and yet so hard!!!!

Against all odds, we ended up with twelve new Nobles thus far for 2023!!!! We had a weak ceremony with our lowest number yet. Our III Sir was bound and determined to increase the numbers, and with his efforts of Cold Sands, we fought back to a reasonable number.

We have no control over our sad 19-to-date Black Camel losses, but the 22 demit/suspension/resigned losses constitute a significant concern and failure for our Shrine family. We must improve on this if we want to survive! It will require all Nobles and Clubs to do their part to help us achieve them and sustain our World's Greatest Philanthropy.

Our III Sir Malcolm Gutfriend was very surprised on his Pote's visit to the Battlefords. He was welcomed by four new Nobles and had to scramble to initiate them but survived it to get the job done!!! We have one Noble to initiate in Prince Albert, Wyn El WA, Indian Head, Moose Jaw and Saskatoon.

Looking forward to next year, I have a very ambitious set of goals we need to deliver on to sustain our World's Greatest Philanthropy. I want to share my thoughts on how these 4 R's (i.e., **Recruitment, Retention, Restoration and Relationships**) have to be the focus of ALL of us for our future generations.

To obtain a more sustained fraternity, there are three main goals WA WA is targeting to improve our Membership, called the "5/2/2 Goals". This keeps us on the right path. They are a) a 5% increase in our **Recruitment** successes, 30 new Nobles; b) a 2% reduction in losing existing Nobles by demits and suspensions, 12 Nobles (i.e., **Retention** of our Nobles that are still on our membership lists. This is primarily supported by maintaining superior **Relationships**); and finally, c) a 2% increase in **Restoring** demitted and suspended Nobles that have already left us. That is only 12 Nobles. Nobles, this is a very ambitious set of goals.

#### RECRUITMENT, RETENTION, RESTORATION AND RELATIONSHIPS

Goals we have yet to sustain in the past. It will require all Nobles and Clubs to do their part to help us achieve them and maintain our World's Greatest Philanthropy.

I will be communicating with you again in the Spring of 2024 re) strategies on the 4 R's, i.e. Recruitment, Retention, Restoration and Relationships, and how you all can play a part in them.

It is now the responsibility of all Nobles, Club/Unit executive/ officers, and especially the Divan to show leadership and commit to making it their No. 1 priority, starting now, so in the coming year, we will have 30 new Nobles Fezzed to stop the membership drain and sustain our Temple.

In summary, membership has got to be a very high priority for our very survival. I am delighted with the efforts that Shriners International is putting into this (by necessity). It is now the responsibility of all Nobles, Club/Unit executive/officers, and especially the Divan to show leadership and commit to making it their No. 1 priority, starting now, so in the coming year, we will have 30 new Nobles Fezzed to stop the membership drain and sustain our Temple.

"As a valued Noble, look deep within yourself, identify what made you a Shriner, and relay your personal story as motivation to another. Some will call this process a re-dedication to Masonic ideals – but others will call it their continued responsibility."

#### **2025 MSA CHALLENGE COIN**

History of the Challenge Coin: Challenge coins represent organizations. They also represent a special event. They have a long-standing tradition in military history. But the military isn't the only service that uses them. First responder services also have an account of using challenge coins, too. They use them to build team morale, link people with similar interests, and promote their brand. Top generals and the President of the United States have their unique challenge coins. It can be used for membership, recognition, to create a bond between people in a group or to commemorate an anniversary or special event. Recently, challenge coins have been used to identify a corporate brand or logo. The traditional Shrine way is to bring out your coin if you see a fellow Noble at a drinking establishment. If that person you challenged doesn't have their coin, honour dictates that they buy you a beverage. ...If that person you challenged does have their coin, then you owe them a beverage for having the audacity to challenge a fellow Noble.

#### **HOSPITAL REPORT**



I would like to report on some inspirational news from three of our patients.

First I would like to share something that was recently sent to me by a patient's mom:

Our trips to Montreal are so important to us for making decisions for Jolene's medical treatments. We have a wonderful endocrinologist in Saskatoon and he helps to coordinate her care. However he is humble enough to acknowledge that a large part of the education he has about OI in particular comes from medical journals that come out of

Montreal Shriners. We are incredibly fortunate that he is supportive of us going to Montreal to keep Dr Rauch in Jolene's circle of care. Dr Rauch has so much medical expertise and so as we were reaching the point where we needed to talk about reducing her treatments it was important to have his guidance. This was a great trip for Jolene in that her density has increased to the point where she now gets to go down to only one infusion per year! Dr Rauch and his team will communicate results and treatment plans with our local team so we can make these changes with confidence.

It is more than just going for an appointment. Having the involvement of the Shriners is so meaningful and while I won't be able to put it into words I will try. Everyone knows that planning a trip is difficult. How are you going to get there, where are you going stay, how are you going to get around town? It is so incredibly nice to not have. The flights get booked and we know that we can just show up and go. When we get to the airport being greeted by a Shriner sure makes Jolene feel special, and provides us with such a sense of relief. It is a friendly face and someone who is there to help. It means we don't need to deal with the lines for a cab, the stress of driving through a busy city with a ton of construction or anything like that.

We can just hop in the van and have a nice visit on the way to the hotel. The hotel starts to feel familiar after more than one trip and therefore gets that extra level of comfort. We get to learn which

coffeeshops, restaurants and metro stations are close to the hotel. That allows us to feel comfortable to enjoy our non hospital time while we are there.

When it is time to go to the hospital we get picked up by another smiling familiar face. We don't have to worry about what traffic will be like or where we will park. We can just go. The hospital itself is so incredibly patient and family focused. Every single person who works there is friendly and just cares. Everything runs so smoothly and it is amazing to think of how much happens in such a short time, and that Jolene thinks it is a fun experience. Then a Shriner takes us back.

From start to finish we know that we have Shriners behind us and that really takes so much stress out of having to travel for medical.

We sure appreciate you! Thank you!




