Each year, the MSMCA, in association with the Midwest Shrine Association, hosts an event for all motorized units from each Shrine Center in the Midwest. Whether you are 2-wheel scooters, go-carts of all shapes and sizes, heavy-weight motorcycles, or anything on two or more wheels, this is the place to be.





There are four main components to the Motor Corps competition:

1. **Drill field:** This is where your group of at least four vehicles performs a choreographed routine from 5 to 10 minutes, including four required formations. You are judged on the skill level of the maneuvers, the execution of the maneuvers, spacing, intervals, and overall quality of the show.
2. **Obstacle course:** There are two obstacle courses, one for two wheels and the other for three or more. This is a timed event, and you compete against others in your category and weight classification for the fastest time.
3. **Slow Ride:** For 2-wheel units only, how long can you stay upright while moving through a 30x30 box? This is an individual competition, and you compete against others in your category and weight classification for the longest time upright.
4. **Showcase:** If you want to get the feel of performing on the drill field without the pressure of judges, give this a chance.

Our competitions are always fun and exciting, and we want you there. The Motor Corps always has an outstanding awards banquet following the competition. Mix and mingle with other motorized units from all over the Midwest.

2023 MONTREAL HOSPITAL SEMINAR

Ill Sir Malcolm Gutfriend & Nobles All,

On April 26th and 27th myself and my lady had the extreme privilege of visiting our Montreal hospital for a seminar and tour of the facility. During this time, we enjoyed a complete tour of the hospital apart from the surgical unit, and we got to see firsthand what the hospital is all about.

The in-person session was very informative and included several keynote speakers who brought forth reports from all areas of the hospital including patient care, finance and donation relations, research and development as well as several speakers from the administrative side of the team. We were greeted on the first day by Mr. Jaques Boissonneault, the hospital's chief administrator who acted as the mc for the two-day seminar and who also provided some interesting statistics that we should all be aware of as Shriners. For exam-

ple, the following numbers from last year were shared. In 2022 the Montreal hospital conducted 20,730 ambulatory care visits, 462 telehealth consultations and performed 1149 surgeries. These figures represent a strong rate of recovery when compared to the pre covid figures and assure us that we are back on track when it comes to in person care. The hospital's outreach clinics saw 266 patients as well in 2022 with another 9781 procedures completed in the rehabilitation centre of the hospital. A very interesting area of the hospital is the motion analysis clinic, which is something straight out of Hollywood, the clinic is constructed as a room that houses several motion cameras, motion sensor equipment and software that tracks and records very precise movements in the joints and feet of the patients we treat, the clinic is used pre and post op as an important tool for the surgeons and rehabilitation therapists to use when determining the scope of future surgeries and treatments for our patients. This clinic uses the exact same technology that Hollywood studios use to produce animated movies and is quite a site to see. In 2022 the motion analysis clinic saw 322 of our own patients and is also used by other care providers for a fee.

Lady Pam and I had the pleasure of listening to a presentation given by our chairman of the board of trustees, Imperial Sir Jerry Gant. Imperial Sir Jerry provided some reports and updates regarding the Vison 2035 program which is striving to reach goals including the development of up to 200 clinical locations to open through out North America with the hope of seeing more kids at a reduced cost. The closest location to us by the sound of things will likely be Calgary. Imperial Sir Jerry also mentioned the

hospital in Mexico which is currently our busiest hospital. This hospital located in Tijuana was originally opened as a clinic and is now conducting around 900 in house surgeries per year. There is a second hospital being developed in Monterey and the predictions are that we will see 4-500 patients a year for surgeries in this location. The burn hospital in Mexico city will be opening a Shriner's treatment center as well which will offset the costs and travel issues which we experience with sending our patients from Mexico to our California hospital. Imperial Sir also reported on our Panama clinic which saw over 800 patients last year resulting in over 400 of them being sent to the United States for treatment. The development of the Shriners transition of care program was mentioned as well which is a program being developed to help our patients transition from childhood to adulthood care. This program will see that our patients are provided with any necessary contacts and information that they will need to make the transition as smooth as possible. Patients will be eligible to start this program at age 14, this program is currently under development at our California location.

A very interesting presentation was given by our head of research and development Dr. Rene St Arnaud. During his presentation we were offered a tour of the main lab which is being used to develop methods of testing bone density as well as software to aide in the research which will allow for earlier detection of brittle bones in children. This development is currently using a special machine referred to as the bone crusher. This machine along with the software uses small samples of bone which are compressed until the breaking point is achieved, the software they are using creates data that can be analyzed by the care provider to help determine

surgical options. At this time the team is using samples from rats and mice and are hopeful that they may be able to use samples from humans within 5 years time. This research is not only fascinating but will lead the world in the field to say the least. Dr. St Arnaud has been with the hospital for most of his career and his level of commitment is unmeasurable.



There were several other presentations which included the nursing staff, the rehab staff, the administration staff and presentations from temples as well. In closing I would like to share a story that touched our hearts the most, this is the story of Fatima and her journey with OI. Fatima was born in Peru with the condition of osteogenesis imperfecta. Fatima's first bone break occurred before she was even delivered if you can imagine that. Fatima's life expectancy was not looking very good with extremely scarce resources to be found in Peru. Luckily for Fatima she was referred to our team at the hospital in Montreal and was deemed to be a patient that we could treat and help to give her a better life.

Just as plans to send Fatima to Canada were about to become reality covid hit the world and unfortu-

nately made travel to Canada impossible for Fatima. During the pandemic our team of surgeons offered to consult with the hospital in Peru that was treating Fatima but sadly with limited resources available Fatima continued to live a life of pain and suffering with little hope for improvement. In the fall of 2022 fate stepped in and the green light was finally given for Fatima to travel to Montreal for surgery. Our team in Montreal performed multiple surgeries on Fatima in the fall of 2022 and she stayed in the hospital working with our rehab team, fighting to recover and build strength. Fatima was given a specially made walking aide that was provided by an anonymous local donator. Without this device Fatima would probably have never been able to walk on her own.



Fatima returned home in the late fall of 2022 and continued her rehab therapy with her mom cheering her on. Fatima continued to see our rehab team daily via zoom during this time. In March of 2023 Fatima returned to Montreal for a follow up procedure and rehab. Fatima, at age 5 took her very first steps in this world at our Montreal hospital thanks to our dedicated team. Fatima is now back in Peru and she is walking with the aide of her walking device and is a hap-

py, bright eyed young lady. In the closing of the presentation our OI team introduced us to Fatima and her mother via zoom. Needless to say there was not a dry eye in the room as her mother thanked us over and over. The story of Fatima is a very touching example of what our OI team in Montreal is achieving every day with patients from Canada and all over the world, they are truly remarkable.

Lady Pam and I wish to thank the temple and Divan

HOSPITAL REPORT



2023 has started out with an average number of hospital visits for WA WA patients. From January 1 to the end of April, flights have been booked for 13 patients. In that same time period, I have had contact with 4 families who were inquiring about treatment for their children. All of those families have filled out intake forms and have sent the forms to the hospital.

Parents with children who might benefit from treatment at one of our hospitals are encouraged to go online and fill out the intake form that's on the Shriners Hospital for Children, Canada website. A team from the hospital will meet and review those intake forms. After a meeting, the parents are then advised as to whether the doctors feel that they can possibly help the child, and if so, an appointment is scheduled. If the child cannot be treated in Montreal, but there is another hospital that might be able to help, he/she is referred to a Shriners hospital in the US.

If you know someone who would like to have their child referred to our hospital, it is nice to speak to them first and let them know about the hospital, what expenses are covered and so on. Any Shriner or a parent can contact me at 306-421-1000 or email at p.deren@sasktel.net

Parental Involvement in Hospital Life

We always like to hear about how our WA WA patients are doing, but we know that their families also become involved in hospital life. Carter Brown's mom, Jennifer Brown, has been giving back in many ways including numerous fundraising projects, and is now directly involved with some other initiatives at the hospital.

Always thankful for the incredible care her son receives at the Shriners Hospital for Children - Canada, Jennifer has been working with different committees at the hospital to help out many more families just like her own. Her 16 year old son, Carter Brown, has Osteogenesis Imperfecta and has been getting treatments and having surgeries at the hospital in Montreal since he was 7 weeks old. Their family has always enjoyed the opportunity to meet and connect with other OI families at the hospital as well. Over the past few years, Jennifer has also been a member of the OI team as the patient and family advocate. This role has allowed her to bring the voice of the parent and the patient to the OI team. It also has given OI families a parent to talk to who has been through much of what they themselves are going

through to provide support, create connections between the families and the hospital, and offer help in any way needed.

Jennifer is also a member of the Family Centered Care Partnership (FCCP). This group is comprised of parents from across Canada as well as various staff members from the hospital. The hospital feels it is important to offer a family-centered care experience for their patients so each child can have their needs met in a way that works for them to reach their full potential. Having a patient and their family engaged in their own care and part of the team is just one thing that makes this hospital so special! The committee meets virtually once a month to discuss what is going on at the hospital, offer ideas from the families perspective, and respond to any issues that may have come up. Recently, the FCCP has also been listening to presentations from hospital staff members on their latest projects in order to give feedback, review documents, or even hop on to a committee or project to help out! One example of that is the development and implementation of virtual reality in treatment situations at the hospital. Jennifer traveled to Ottawa in November to attend the Children's Healthcare Canada conference with another



parent from the FCCP and a few staff members from the hospital. They attended two days full of informative sessions and came away with many great ideas to make our hospital and family connections even better than they already are! We are so lucky to have a hospital that truly values the relationship between staff and the families they work with every day!

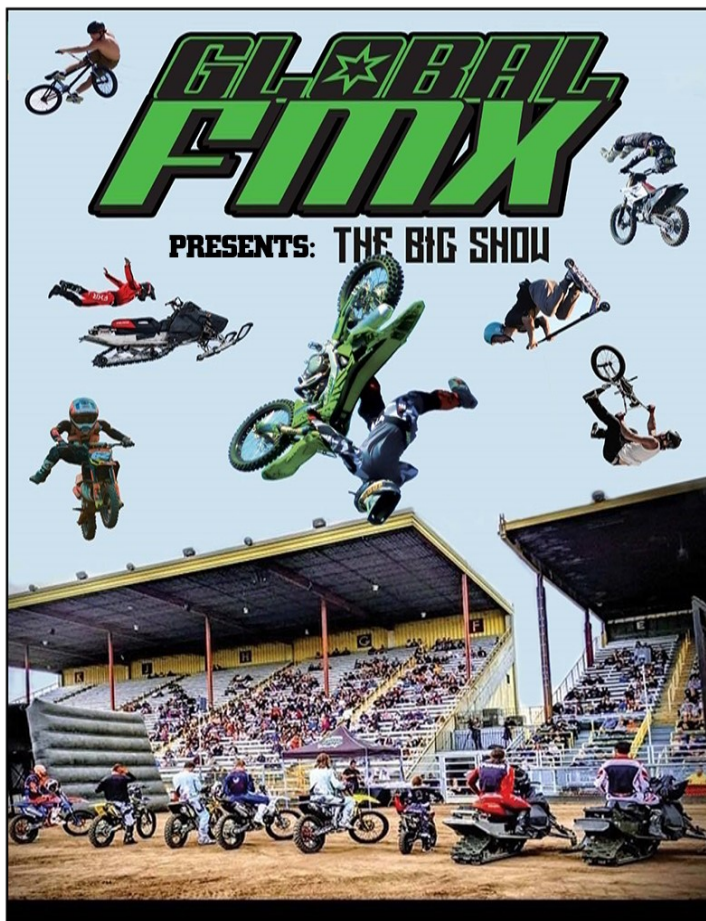
