RECORDER'S MESSAGE



Well, it looks like the summer is over. It was great to see so many Shriners out to different parades around the province. This is one of the best ways to get the WA WA Shriners' name out to the the public. We really need to make them aware that we are still around and helping children.

Another question that WA WA gets asked is " can we donate to a Charity after we have filled our obligations to the Shrine and Temple". Our Illustrious Potentate has been to Imperial meetings and the very same question has come up and had some intense discussions.

Basically, it is referred to as "DE MINIMIS DONATIONS OF FRATERNAL FUNDS" (legalese term).

It is permissible for a Temple or Club, with the approval of the Potentate, to make a de minimis donation of fraternal funds to a charity or community organization other than Shriners Hospitals for Children or Shriners International Education Foundation. A donation is "de minimis" if it and all other such donations from that Temple or Club do not annually exceed \$1,000.00. (U.S.D.).

Therefore, the temple or club is limited to \$1,000 USD annually for donations to other charities. The amount is cumulative. So, for example in the case of PASC they are limited to a donation of roughly \$1,300 per calendar year. My suggestion would be that if they would like to make a \$2000 donation, they donate \$1000 this year and \$1,000 next year. It was pointed out that the club cumulative total and the temple cumulative total are separate.

There will be no Fall Ceremonial this year (not enough Candidates). However, we will do a short form version of initiation as required.

Thank you to everyone who sent in pictures for the Cash Calendar. Hopefully everyone can sell their assigned calendars. If you need more, call the office (we have about 200 extra and would really like to see them sold this year).

If you have other questions, please do not hesitate to call me.

MEMBERSHIP REPORT

Ill Sirs and Nobles AllI trust this finds you well as we say goodbye to summer and look forward to a great fall and harvest in many areas. Most lodges that went dark for the summer will be getting back to work and settling back into their usual routine. This will be a great time to look to our M.M.s who still need to journey to the Shrine to solicit them for our Philanthropy.

The BeAShrinerNow.com website has been modernized, offering quality information about our fraternity, and serves as a remarkable landing page for anyone who wishes to become a Shriner. Most importantly, it is now mobile device-friendly. Likewise, BeAFreemason.org was developed by the Scottish Rite, Northern Masonic Jurisdiction, in partnership with the Southern Jurisdiction and Shriners International, as a centralized landing page for prospects interested in Freemasonry. These websites work collaboratively to bring awareness to our Craft. While non-Masons will still need to be initiated, passed and raised before submitting an e-Petition to become a WA WA Shriner, these tools are available. They should be included in discussions with your Masonic (and non-Masonic) friends and colleagues. Membership is our #1 priority and is the responsibility of each of our Nobles.

Our growth this year for new members could have been better. Thus far 2023, we have a net loss of 26 members. Our Ceremonial in June yielded the lowest number of new Nobles in recent history. Let's band together and provide a positive experience and a warm welcome to any new prospect we receive and do what we can to refer non-Shriners to our sites so they can share in our fraternity! It is important to remember that a temple's existence dramatically depends on a robust and ongoing membership program. It is essential to identify and recruit new members from our Masonic fraternity. Membership is something that must be addressed at every opportunity. No matter where you travel or to whom you speak, it would be best never to forget to "THINK MEMBERSHIP."

It should be the #1 priority and the responsibility of EVERY member to assist with membership development. The Shrine Membership program can be used to recruit Masons as The Shrine can be a giant drawing card to recruit these new Masons. Often, the Shrine can provide the FUN that keeps a Mason returning to his Blue Lodge and the Shrine. Individual Shriner participation in the Lodge is crucial to foster relations with Masons and always be on the prowl for new Shrine candidates. I have a lot of information to give to prospects.

CULTURAL CHANGE – CULTURAL CHANGE MUST HAPPEN at our temple and Club to achieve membership success and to become a vibrant, growing fraternity. An example would be to more actively involve the younger family members and possibly form new units and clubs that are relevant in today's society. Net Membership Growth Over Six Months

The first six months of 2023 have yielded the organization's overall net membership growth, with 85 Shrine Centers posting positive membership growth – a significant feat to be genuinely proud of. The last time we knew this achievement was confirmed, Bill Clinton was the U.S. President.

Hitting this incredible milestone is tangible proof of something we Shriners have always known: Good men are hungry to incorporate more fun and fellowship into their lives. They value meaningful connections with other people and long to be a part of something greater than themselves. They are finding all of this with us, as Shriners.

How did the Shriners turn things around? By remembering who we are as Shrine Masons, intentionally putting in the work, and giving one another unwavering support. This milestone is a culmination of a team effort across many skill positions at a local and international level to get us across the goal line.

Some areas we've worked on to demonstrate and increase our value as an organization to current and potential members:

Events and Activities Growth

To broaden our appeal, we focused heavily on generational investment and "building your own experience." We've encouraged Shriners to create new avenues for enjoying fun and fellowship and investing in their ideas.

In 2023, members across Shriners International created more than 110 new clubs and units. That is a massive win for the Shriners looking for a new spark in the fraternity.

In addition, the fraternity added nearly 400 new leaders aged 45 and under last year, serving as board members of their Shrine Center and as club and unit officers. This is not only a win for us in the present time — these younger men have the potential to position Shriners for success for years to come.

THE NEXT STEP

We will conduct as many Cold Sands as needed this Fall, so new candidate applications would be much appreciated **ASAP.** (Our troubles are behind us if each member keyed in on a relative, friend, or acquaintance and solicited one individual for next year.)

Let's look to this Fall with optimism and opportunity and make an outstanding effort to increase our Membership to positive growth.

The Moosomin Shrine Club is one of the local groups that has provided support to Levi and his family.

"The Shriners have been a huge support to me and my family. They helped us travel to Philadelphia, Pennsylvania three times to a spinal cord specialist there and it has been awesome travelling to visit the specialists there. It is pretty good going down there, they are good people and have helped me a lot.

"I didn't expect any help from the Shriners, they kind of just came to me. There is obviously a specialist for everything and I didn't know where it was until they reached out to my family and let us know they have one in Philadelphia for spinal cord injuries. I still see the specialist there, they actually have a brand new chair sitting there waiting for me. They have specialists for everything down there, spinal cord, physio, seatings, measuring you for a wheelchair and usually they have someone who can help you out with anything. The support is awesome. It is so nice to have the Shriners to send me to Philadelphia to get the treatments I need. The support has also helped me accept the fact that my way of life has changed, but my family and friends haven't."

149TH SHRINERS INTERNATIONAL IMPERIAL SESSION

The 149th Shriners International Imperial Session was held in Charlotte, NC from July 2 to July 6, 2023. An Imperial Session is a joint meeting between the Iowa Corporation (Shriners International – the fraternity) and the Colorado Corporation (Shriners Hospitals – the philanthropy). Legislation is discussed, reports from committees are received and the Imperial Officers and Trustees are elected and installed.

There are always a number of bylaw amendments to consider. A number deal with temples changing their physical location and jurisdictional boundaries and the creation of new temples. This year we granted Charters to two new temples that were under dispensation: Salah Shriners, Brazil and Lubnan Shriners, Lebanon. Our international growth is strong.

Two important pieces of legislation came to the floor. First was a motion to increase the per capita by \$30 USD. The increase was necessary as cost have increased while membership has decreased. Shriners International has made every move to reduce costs, yet last year they had to draw down 25% of the reserves. This was not a sustainable situation. Much discussion and debate ensued. The finance committee had originally proposed a \$20 increase, which was explained to the delegates in a series of Zoom conferences prior to the Imperial Session. The need for the additional \$10 was explained, but it was not well received by the delegates and the motion, which required a 2/3 majority to pass, was defeated. Following the procedures in Robert's rules of order it was brought back to the floor with an amendment for a \$20 increase as had been originally proposed. It was vigorously debated and passed.

The second piece of significant legislation was a proposal to change the requirement to become a Shriner to being a Mason from a Master Mason. This would mean that an Entered Apprentice or Fellowcraft would be eligible to join. The debate over this proposal was passionate with good points being raised by each side. In the end the proposal was soundly defeated and the delegates sent a strong message that being a Master Mason is still an important part of being a Shriner.

We elected and welcomed our new Imperial Potentate, Imperial Sir Ed Stolze, and elected our new Imperial Outer Guard, Imperial Sir David Hamm. Both are excellent men and Shriners and will serve us well.

The 150th Imperial Session will be held in Reno, NV from June 30 to July 4, 2024. Consider attending and spend a few days meeting and having fun with Shriners from all over the world and see what really goes on at an Imperial session.

The Midwest Shrine Association (MSA) was created to engender greater fellowship among the MSA Shrine Temples and their members and to secure a more significant recognition of Shriners International throughout the territories of this association. MSA's sixteen Temples from the States of Iowa, Minnesota, North and South Dakota, Wisconsin and Michigan, and Temples from Manitoba and Saskatchewan converged on the tiny tourist area of Alexandra, MN. They left a memorable impression and historical footprint on the location and neighbouring communities on August 23 – 26.

The Midwest Shrine Association holds two primary functions each year. Each February, the winter session is a business meeting (a Stag Event) for executive officers, committee heads, and association units. The summer session and conference are open to all Shriners and their families, which include various social events, all shriner parades, and Unit competitions. All MSA Shriners are invited to attend.

Illustrious Sir Malcolm Gutfriend led a caravan of approximately 30 Nobles, Ladies and Children of WA WA Shriners to attend the annual MSA summer session in Alexandria, MN, hosted by Osman Shriners.

There were 547 Nobles, 275 Ladies, five children 13-17 years of age and 17 children under 12. Wednesday night was the welcoming party. Over 300 people attended and enjoyed a tremendous picnic-style meal of brats and burgers. Two parades highlighted 14 Temples participating with units of varying degrees, with hundreds of Shriners participating in the parade. WA WA Temple had its outstanding ambulance driven by Al McDougall, and the semi-truck by Ill Sir Bob Keep PP supplied by Ill Sir Harry Martin PP. With their incredible antics, the Drill Corp and T-Birds rounded out the WA WA units.

The Thursday Oasis served over 700 people with smoked pork, libations, etc. The Saturday Oasis served over 450 lunches for people before heading home from a great MSA.

The Osman Auxiliary held a "Pluck a Duck" fundraiser that featured hundreds of Fez-wearing rubber ducks floating around the lazy river in the Arrowwood water park. The Auxiliary raised approximately \$3,500.00

The Packerland Clan of Hillbillies held a moonshine tasting for about 45 people, followed by the presentation of the Hillbilly degree for both Nobles and Ladies that boasted 60 people or so going through the degree.

Other events for all to absorb were the Shriners Marketplace with many great Vendors selling and displaying their wares, Pontoon rides, MSA trap shoot, Putting contest, Midwest Motor Corp presentations and competitions, Clown competitions, Horse Patrol and competitions, Diva Derby, Ancient Order of Camel Herder's degree, Ladies luncheon, Midwest Chanter Concert, Moonshine Tasting, Hillbilly degree, pluck a duck contest and ending with so-cial hour and dinner at the Lakeside with an Aloha theme featuring a great live band.

WA WA Shriners is now hosting the 2025 MSA winter and summer sessions as we were squeezed into the line-up due to our 2020 COVID cancellations. We will be calling on all clubs and units in WA WA to start the process of polishing their gear and uniforms and tuning up all vehicles and other apparatus, all the while looking for recruits to WA WA Shrines for this prestigious event to be held in Moose Jaw Saskatchewan.



HOSPITAL REPORT



For those of you who were able to attend the FMX Bike Show that was held in Estevan on June 3, you had the extra bonus of being able to hear two young men, both Shriner patients, speak about their experiences at the Montreal hospital.

Carter Brown spoke with III. Sir Malcolm Gutfriend during the intermission at the afternoon show. Carter said, "Without all that the Shriners do, I wouldn't be able to travel to the Shriners Hospital for all of my life-changing treatments and surgeries." Carter has made over 60 trips to the hospital in Montreal.

He went on to tell about his condition, Osteogenesis Imperfecta, or brittle bone disease, and how many broken bones he has had. As a baby, his parents were told that he would never walk and probably never sit by himself. With summer coming to a close, most of our parade dates have concluded. There are still a few upcoming venues this fall, but for the most part we are beginning to wrap up.


