WA WA Shriners was granted its dispensation in December 1, 1910, and received its charter on July 12th, 1911. WA WA Shriners ranks as the 123rd Temple founded according to the date of the charter. The first installment and investiture of Officers was conducted by the Potentate and Divan of Al Azhar Shrine of Alberta. WA WA jurisdiction included the entire Province of Saskatchewan, thereby embracing one of the largest territories in Shrinedom. WA WA has chartered seventeen clubs throughout the province. WA WA Shriners is located in Regina with 11 active clubs throughout the province.

THE FEZ

The red fez with a black tassel, the Shrine's official headgear, has been handed down through the ages. It derives its name from the place where it was first manufactured – the holy city of Fez, Morocco. Some historians claim it dates back to about 980 A.D. RECORDER'S MESSAGE

It has been a busy first 2 months transitioning into the Recorder position. The challenge of learning the position was made a little more difficult when our administrator Karen Watkins received a surgery date and went on medical leave on March 2 for a period of 4 months. Luckily there was sufficient notice to hire a temporary replacement and Kiera Penny started on February 2. She was in the office for most of February allowing her to overlap with Karen and receive training in most activities. Starting March 2, she took over all duties of the position including the financial responsibilities (receiving invoices, issuing cheques, making journal entries, etc.), management of the website, sending messages by constant contact and general clerical duties.

One of the tasks that we needed to do was to verify e-mail addresses and Kiera has recently been e-mailing and phoning the Nobles to confirm contact information. The result has been several updated emails and addresses and some very happy Nobles with the personal contact. My time has been occupied learning the office systems, the filing protocols and training Kiera. Luckily, she is sharp, personable and willing to take on tasks. The challenging part is that there have been a few things that neither of us know and have had to figure out. I am currently working on filling in my knowledge gaps and making sure all the required information has been filed with Shriners International.

The office needs a major clean up and document purge. The most recent Document Retention Schedule from Shriners International gives the required file retention dates, and we have many files that are 10-15 years or more past the retention deadline. Almost all of us hate to throw anything out but there comes a time when it is necessary. I'll be looking at this over the next few weeks to identify what needs to be kept and what can be discarded. I will also share this schedule with the Club Secretaries to assist them with their own document challenges.

I would like to thank you for your trust and support in electing me as your recorder. There is a lot to learn and I thank those who came before me. I ask that you be patient with both Kiera and I as we learn the jobs. We both learned lots before Karen left, but we regularly discover things that we aren't sure how to do.

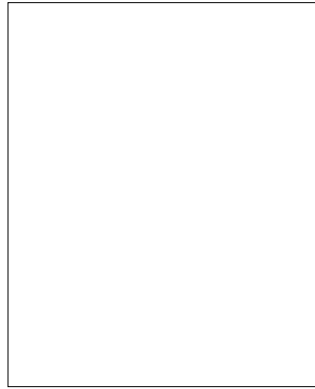

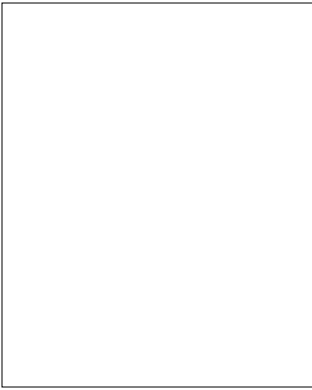

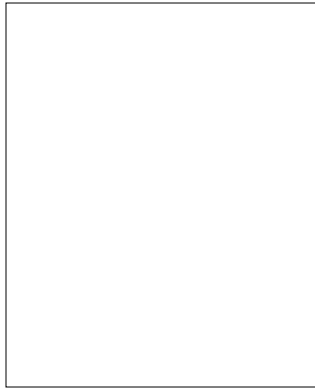

SHRINERS HOSPITAL FOR CHILDREN CANADA SHCC

Board of Governors Report

What an exciting and momentous year Shriners Childrens Canada has had as 2025 marked the 100th anniversary of your Hospital and the 10th anniversary of our current building. It was a year in which we celebrated our many achievements and the advances that we made in health care that have helped so many children lead better lives.

From new devices such as the Fassier-Duval rod used in the treatment of Osteosis imperfecta to the drug treatments that revolutionized the treatment of OI and became the world standard to the improved techniques and better materials used in bracing that can offer an early intervention in the treatment of scoliosis we are having a profound impact on children's futures. Our research and development into the causes of bone disorders continues to advance the science and although there may never be a cure, by better understanding the disease, we can better design and optimize treatments and therapies.

Throughout the year our in addition to our primary mission of focussing on care, much effort was focussed on Vision 2035 which is our mission to see more kids in the right places offering the best medicine while providing our services at a lower cost.

We are seeing more kids. At the end of 2025, we saw 14,900 patients of which 7,000 were new and had 29,400 visits to our clinic. Our doctors performed 1,421 life changing surgeries and we had 13,500 rehabilitation interventions. There was significant growth in eery area compared to previous years.

We are working diligently to ensure that we are seeing the kids in the right places. We are working with physical therapists and other rehab therapists through out Quebec to ensure the children we treat in Montreal can get their follow up therapy in their local communities. We have a very successful outreach clinic in New Brunswick and have established similar clinics in Newfoundland and Labrador. Our Canadian expansion initiative continues to build partnerships with pediatric hospitals across Canada. We have a teaching, research and outpatient clinic arrangement with the Childrens Hospital of the London Health Sciences Centre and a research fellowship partnership with CHEO in Ottawa. Negotiations are ongoing with other facilities, and the goal is to complete two more agreements this year and start work on at least one more. The work to develop a partnership is complex, involved and takes a substantial amount of time. Doctors, Administrators, Managers, Lawyers, Hospital Boards and provincial Departments of Health must all come to an agreement. Saskatchewan is still on the radar and there have been ongoing discussions with the Pattison hospital. I can assure you that WA WA involvement will be key and we will be consulted about any plan or proposal.

We continue to offer the best medicine for the conditions we treat. In addition to the world leading treatments for OI and scoliosis, the protocols that we developed for rapid screening of newborns for hip dysplasia have led to very early interventions and the condition being completely corrected in most infants very soon after birth. Our motion analysis lab is a world class facility and had over 500 visits last year. A visit results in a very detailed analysis of motion of the body allowing the interventions and therapeutic treatments to be fine tuned. Our genetic testing laboratory specializes in skeletal and bone disorders and provides clinicians with an exact diagnosis of the condition. This research has helped identify the precise gene which causes OI type 4 allowing research of the pathways of the disease and offering a chance to develop gene therapies.

Nursing research is making great strides in pain management. We are actively using Virtual Reality headsets to help children manage the pain while undergoing procedures. We have hosted conferences to teach other how to make use of the technology as well as to improve our tools.

Lower cost does not meet cutting costs and “cheapening” our care. Rather it means that we are being good stewards of our funds. To this goal we are implementing several changes including two large software changes. We are moving to a single supply management program across the hospital system. This will allow us to improve our tracking of supplies and other materials. We will be able to compare between sites and suppliers and we be able to optimize our local supply room. Human Resources will also move onto this platform allowing us to better compare between operations and look for best practices. We are changing our medical software to Epic, to bring us in line with the Shrine system and many other hospitals. This is a major initiative improving patient files, service tracking and analysis and allow easier comparisons between sites.

I am pleased to report on the 2025 fundraising campaign. We had a very successful year raising over \$4.5 million which was 123% of our goal of \$4.3 million. This was due to the generosity of our Nobles, Ladies, Clubs, Units and Temples along with other individual donors and other fraternal groups such as the Daughters of the Nile. The increases are also a result of the hard work of our Director of Philanthropy, Chad Polito, and his team. He works very hard to develop and foster relationships with donors. This financial support helps us meet our budget and avoid a deficit meaning that we don’t have to draw down on the endowment fund.

The celebration of our first hundred years is over, and it is now time for us to focus on the future which is bright as we work together to help children lead better lives. Our care and the support that you give make this possible. Spread the word and make sure everyone knows about Shriners, our hospitals and the care we can provide. Be proud of everything you do and the children that you help

I would like to thank Ill. Sir Stu Larson for my appointment as WA WA Hospital Committee Chair for 2026.

Noble Paul Deren, along with Lady Cheryl, has been doing this important work since the passing of our previous Hospital Chair, Noble Stan Sandomirsky in August of 2019. I would like to thank them for their work and dedication to our patients and their families.

The key role of the Hospital Chair is to coordinate travel for Saskatchewan Shriner patients. The Hospital Chair also provides information about our hospitals back to WA WA and helps Nobles find information for potential patients and their families. These days, many patients now connect with our hospitals directly, through the Hospital website, but I will also be available to help make these connections.

Most patients need air transportation to Montreal, while a few travel to other Shriner Children's hospitals. Once patients have a confirmed hospital appointment, Lady Leeann and I will consult with their parents to find and book flights with the best combination of timeliness, convenience, and affordability. We will use WA WA's supply of Aeroplan miles, WestJet credits, and funds from the Patient Transportation Fund. Noble Paul has warned me that I'll be dealing with the obstacles of changed appointments, cancelled flights, and missed connections.

Lady Leeann and I have watched Noble Paul and Lady Cheryl's interaction with Shrine patients, and we know how hard they have worked to make this job look easy. I hope that we can match their example and continue to make our patients' travel as stress-free as possible.

Once I learn the details of the position, you can expect future Hospital Reports to include details about the numbers of patients we have sent to Shriner facilities. I will also be available to co-ordinate patient speakers for WAWA events.

I expect this position to be extremely rewarding – an opportunity to do some firsthand work at the heart of our mission: helping our Shrine kids.

Indian Head Shrine Club



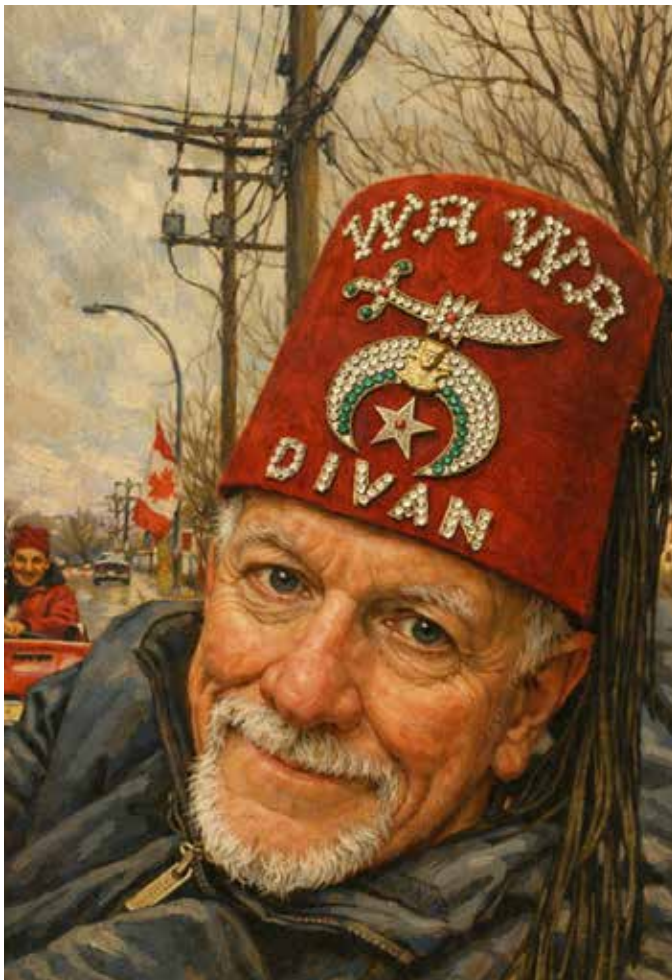
